INTRODUCTION

The Australian Speleological Federation will hold its fourteenth biennial conference at Flinders University in Adelaide from January 3 to 7, 1983.

From its inception, the A.S.F. has played a key role in co-ordinating the transfer of speleological knowledge between, and maintaining a code of ethics for, Australian cavers. The biennial conference is the main event where cavers from Australia can

meet in person, exchange views and explore unfamiliar caves.

OBJECTIVES

The main objective of the Conference is to promote discussion and interchange of ideas on all aspects of caving and speleology. This will help to spread safe easy caving practices, preserve and conserve our caves and appreciation of the complexity of karst with its peculiarity of a high integration of specialized studies.

Papers are called for in categories given below, and the accompanying notes are intended as a guide.

VISUAL ASPECTS OF CAVE RECORDING AND DISPLAY

This will cover all aspects of cave recording. Topics include photography in 2D and 3D by stills, movie and T.V.; trends in cave mapping with alternative methods of depicting caves; holograms; and the use of visual data retrieval aids.

Application in surveying, scientific recording and navigation are possible.

THE FUTURE OF AUSTRALIAN CAVES AND CAVING

A vital issue for conservationists who are trying to protect the caves and the cavers who are trying to use them. So far the conferences have been used by people as a means of emphasising the need for cave protection.

Persons interested in the physical pleasure of caving need to come forward and balance the conference content instead of just objecting verbally or ignoring the plight of our caves.

Institutionalised cave management is increasing throughout Australia. Indeed the A.S.F. plays a major role in coordinating the exchange of management ideas between government bodies. Your constructive suggestions on achieving a working relationship between cavers, speleologists and government could alter your future weekend activity.

Other pertinent issues include how advances in technology affect speleology and the population pressure on caves.

OTHER ACTIVITIES IN CAVES, CAVING AND KARST

This includes anything not on the Conference themes - caves, techniques, equipment, speleological topics and all those good ideas you have that others should know about.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Papers are expected to be presented in 10 - 20 minutes, with 5 - 10 minutes for discussion. The Conference Proceedings will include the full text of a paper but the presentation should only include the essence or highlights of the full text.

Guidelines for authors are available on request.

Other presentations, such as new equipment or techniques will enter the Proceedings as either a written paper or from notes and diagrams made during the session.

The Proceedings of the Conference should be available by June, 1983 and will include all papers received by 1st March, 1983. Papers submitted after that date will probably be omitted except as an abstract.

Pre-publication cost of Proceedings is \$11.00.
