EDITORIAL

With the A.G.M. fast approaching, it is perhaps an opportune time to review the last year and to make plans for this year. SUSS, last year, dragged itself from the quagmire of 1961 and as a consequence many trips were held and a fair amount of constructive work was done in the various areas. The Jenolan Survey has just been completed and the results of this survey should become evident in the next few weeks when the map will be published.

There was still a shortage of trip leaders and of course the usual shortage of transport. While there is little we can do about the latter problem, there are many people in the Society who have the experience and ability to lead trips. In fact, every full or associate member should aim to lead at least one trip in the coming year.

The lack of trip leaders could be due to one of two things:

- (1) Laziness
- or (2) A misunderstanding of the qualifications needed for a trip leader.

It is true that full responsibility for any misconduct on the trip rests on the trip leader but this need not worry any aspiring trip leader as a well run trip is not condusive to misconduct; it is only those trips which are loosely organised that give rise to such misconduct as we had early in 1962. So next time you feel like complaining about the lack of trips drag yourself up and lead one.

The trend is now going away from the alcoholic trips which gave us such a bad name with other societies and we are now entering what we might call a "new era". This "era" is seeing us enter on new projects which are once again restoring us to the position of the Premier N.S.W. Society.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMMENDMENT

Notice is hereby given of a proposed revision to Clause 3b of the Constitution concerning conditions of membership. This revision is to be considered at the first General Meeting to be held following a period of twenty eight (23) days from the 19th March 1963.

The proposed change is from:-

"3b. Before admission to any grade of membership, a candidate must have completed at least thirty (30) hours caving in non-tourist caves on at least two (2) official trips to the satisfaction of the Society, and be approved by the Committee."

to:-

- "3b.i. Before admission to any grade of membership, a candidate shall be approved by the Committee, and shall satisfy the Sosiety in compliance with the following conditions; completion of at least twenty (20) hours caving in non-tourist caves on at least two (2) official trips; knowledge of safety precautions, search and rescue procedures and first-aid; satisfactory leadership of a short caving trip (minimum two hours) in the company of experienced cavers; application for membership to be made within six (6) months of first joining the Society as a Prospective Member (except at the discretion of the Committee).
- ii. A Sub-Committee shall be elected by the Society and maintained, to consist of at least three members of the Society, which shall be known as the Membership Standards Sub-Committee, whose duties it shall be to recommend to the Society the exact content of the conditions to be complied with under Clause 3b i., and to act for the Society in ensuring that such of these conditions as the Society may accept are carried out. Such exact conditions when accepted by the Society shall be embodied as Bye-Laws of the Society.

The Society shall have three possible courses of action in considering an application to Membership; acceptance, rejection, or deferment for a period not exceeding six (6) months pending satisfactory evidence of compliance with Membership requirements in accordance with this Constitution."
