

#### TRIP REPORTS

JENOLAN

16-17 December, 1967

Present: Denis Ward (L), Pete Boshier (M), Bruce Kirby (P).

The aim of this trip was primarily to explore a hole found by
Pete Boshier on a previous Jenolan effort. The hole is located
in the Northern Limestone, some 70 yards distant and 50 feet
above Wiburd's Lake Cave (the entrance itself is a mere 100'

from the contact marking the termination of the Northern . Limestone).

After the usual preliminaries with the Chief Guide the party finally made its way up McKeown's Creek on Saturday afternoon. Upon negotiating a rockpile located at the entrance of the hole we were confronted by a narrow squeeze which sloped down at an angle of approx. 350-400. It was the drop at the bottom of the squeeze that prevented further exploration on the last trip, owing to the lack of any equipment, however on this occasion we had with us sufficient rope to set up a belay station, which we

proceeded to do.

At the bottom of the drop (which turned out to be a mere 25' chimney of the portable handhold type) was a high, narrow passage which led to a caverameasuring roughly 50'x30', the floor of which was strewn with boulders of all shapes and sizes- very little mud was found. Pressure chipping was evident in numerous places- all pointing to the obvious instability of the whole cave. Some 20 minutes was spent exploring the rockpile located on the floor of the cavern opposite the entrance passage. Exploration continued by way of a squeeze which inclined out into another smaller, but equally unstable cavern. Unfortunately at the end of the second cavern was another 25-35' drop, at the bottom of which one could see a possible continuation-again owing to lack of equipment further exploration was halted.

At a later date I found that the cave had previously been entered by Erik Halbert, however, only as far as the first cavern—there was no evidence of anyone having previously entered the squeeze leading to the second cavern—little wonder when one notes

its position and size.

For anyone wishing to continue exploration of the cave the

following advice may be of some use:-

a) The party should be kept down to a minimum number of persons. Because of the obvious instability of the cave a large

party would be hazardous.

b) In order to set up a ladder at the terminal drop extra wire traces will be necessary owing to the lack of secure positions in the area immediately at the top of the drop.
