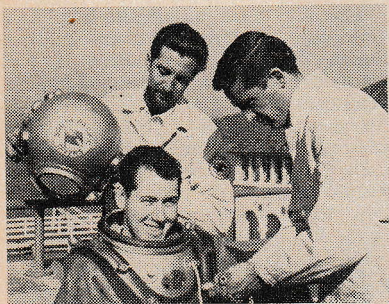


AROUND THE CLUBS:—
