ARTIFICIAL REEF & WATER ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE

Report on Meeting held on 24th May, 1972

Meeting began at 8.00P.M. at Sutherland Council Chambers.

An informal meeting was held to discuss the method of installing the Artificial Reef at Port Hacking between Carruthers Bay and Lilly Pilly Point in 40 feet of water. The Reef will be constructed of car tyres in triangular bundles of 100 totalling 600,000 tyres in an area of 200 y 2 600 yards. The tyres are to be weighed down by a number of concrete blocks. Committee has applied to the various Departments for permission to lay the reef in this area and Dr. Bruce Malcolm (Fisheries Department) assured the Meeting that it will be passed within the next eight weeks. Another Meeting will be called when permission is obtained. The bundling of the tyres will be done within an area at Lilly Pilly Pt. where a cyclone fence and large wor k shed will be erected by the Council for the duration of the construction which is expected to take between 12 and 18 months. This time will probably be reduced as the Fisheries Department is intending to put a permanent staff on for this Artificial Reef Project which will be the largest of its type in the World. Dr. Bruce Malcolm and two of his colleagues showed the Committee photographs and slides of smaller versions of the proposed reef where it was quite apparent that fish had migrated to this area almost immediately and within a few months the tyres had become quite encrusted with growth and fish species had increased to a large number.

Further information will be published as it comes to hand.
