WARNING: MEMBERS TAKE NOTE

I wish to advise all club members to disregard an advertisement on page 9 of Skindiving in Australia Vol 14 No. 3. which offers the public pieces of eight for sale.

The advertsiement mentions the fact that the coins offered for sale are a lasting reminder of the many spanish galleons that were wrecked over 250 years ago along the Australian coast.

I wish to state categorically that there is no known spanish wreck on our coast, let along 250 years of them. I reported this matter to the Department of Home Affairs and Environment, in Canberra, and they will be investigating further. I also reported this to other relevant authorities and they also indicated that they too will be investigating this matter.

When I reported this matter to Skindiving in Australia, representative in this state, and after he had a conference I believe with the editor in Melbourne, I was told that the magazine had no control over what an advertiser places in his advertisements and they wouldn't print a retraction.

I feel that this is irresponsible for a magazine that generally had a good reputation amongst divers and has been around for a long time. The editor should have been aware of the fact that there has been no known spanish wrecks along the Australian coast. They have been made aware of this serious breach, of various acts, and will not print a retraction or dissassate themselves from the advertiser in writing.

So, fellow members, be beware of this add.
