Course Outline: * How your camera works; selecting the right lens.

- * Care and maintenance of camera gear; troubleshooting.
- * Lighting: natural and flash, fill flash, lightmeters, balancing flash with ambient light, multi-strobe use. Purchasing a strobe
- what to look for.
- * Composition; rules of composition, where to place a diver in photo, hints for producing good wide angle photographs.
- * Macro photography; how to take better close-ups.
- * Speciality areas of underwater photography night, fish portraits, turbid water, tropical, shipwrecks, deep water.
- * How to make your photos look better; how to crop your photos.
