With sun shining and a strong westerly blowing a small band of intrepid divers met at Shellharbour to enjoy a first for S.P.D., a fish-photo competion. The idea was to photograph as many species of fish as possible from a pre-published list - and some of the species were not all that common! (Ever photographed a Bonito?)

Neil (V), Penny, Wendy, Tony Martin, Neil (K)f and Eve were the participants. Most had cameras, but a few were along for the dive.

The competition was to take place at the gravel loader at Bass Point. When we arrived the seas were exceptionally flat and soon the competition was underway.

Visibility was a murky 5 metres and decreased at the end of the loader. Schools of Yellowtail and Pike were common in the shallows and under the loader. This was coupled with a prolific amount of temperate fish and lots of tropicals - due to the relatively warm water.

After one dive, we adjourned to Shellharbour. The dive had been enjoyable for all but proved a bonanza for Wendy. She found an intact \$100 near the edge of the rocks when commencing her dive. Instead of bringing it back to the car she put it somewhere safe - down the top of Penny's costume! Doug, I imagine, must feel proud he has trained Penny so well.

When the film was processed Neil Vincent was the winner, with 15 species and 82 points.

# CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF CYLINDERS

- 1. Handle cylinders with care and avoid dropping or rough treatment.
- 2. Charged cylinders should be stored preferably in the vertical position in a cool dry place away from excessive heat or direct exposure to the sun.
- 3. Cylinders should not be left on damp ground or wijjout adequate protection from the weather.

- 4. Once a cylinder has put into service it should never be left completely discharged. A slight positive pressure should always register on the guage.
- 5. To prevent corrosion and deteriation wash the cylinder after use with clean fresh water and thoroughly dry. Also remove the boot if fitted and wash this area.
- 6. Recharging should only be undertaken with proper equipment which ensures that the compressed air is free from moisture, oil and other impurities and is fit for breathing purposes.

NEVER PUT OXYGEN OR ANY GAS OTHER THAN AIR IN AN AIR

CYLINDER.

- 7. Do not use heat or chemical strippers to remove old paint from cylinders <u>unless</u> you have been advised by a competent person it is safe to do so. Rather be safe than sorry.
- 8. Always have your cylinders tested every 12 months as they should not be filled if they are out of date.
  - 9. REMEMBER OVERCHARGING OF CYLINDERS IS DANGEROUS.
