#### UNDERWATER PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION

This year, the competition will be conducted over three months. Each month's competition will close at 11.00p.m. on the night of the Club meeting for that month. The competition will be run over the months of January, February and March.

The rules of the competition are;

- 1. The competition is open only to financial members of South Pacific Divers.
- 2. The entries for each month are restricted as follows:
  - \*January entries are open only to those entrants who have not won a prize in any underwater photography competition.
  - \*February entries are open to any entrant who has not won a major prize in an <u>opens</u> underwater photography competition e.g. 1st, 2nd or 3rd in past S.P.D. competitions or at Oceans or 1st Novice in a S.P.D. competition.
  - \*March entries are open to all members.
- 3. Each entrant may submit a maximum of five slides per month.

  Of the five entries one must be a macro photograph, another a
  wide-angle photograph e.g. taken with a 35mm lense or wider.

  Only the best macro and the best wide-angle photograph each
  month will be included in the monthly pointscore.
- 4. Photographs that have won prizes in past photographic competitions cannot be submitted. Also, entries for each month of the competition must be a different portfolio of photographs. i.e. no photograph can be resubmitted.
- 5. Entries must be underwater photographs and are not restricted by geographical location.
- 6. All entries must be taken by the entrant.
- 7. All entries must be colour transparencies.



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- 8. Entries may be cropped or masked to achieve desired effects. No other changes to the original slide other than these are allowed.
- 9. Slides taken in aquariums are not acceptable.
- 10. The winner and entrants each month will receive a score for the place they achieve (different from their slides score). This score is cumulative through the competition. The highest cumulative score at the end of the competition will be declared the overall winner. The scores each month will be:
