The night dive has been planned for Saturday 3 October 1992, starting at 7.00pm. All are welcomed to join in this unique opportunity.



### **DIVE REPORT - SOLOMONS**

During early August, 5 South Pacific Divers (John Fowden, Russell Stoker, Paul Millard, Paul Wildish and Michael McFadyen), together with 22 other divers from Shiprock Dive, travelled to the Solomon Islands for the 50th Anniversary of the Battle of Guadalcanal.

We dived the Japanese wrecks Hirokawa Maru and Kinugawa Maru (Bonegi 1 & 2) a number of times. They were destroyed in the middle part of the battle while trying to resupply the Japanese Army which had been pushed back beyond the present location of Honiara. We also dived the Kyushu Maru (Ruiniu) and the wreck of the Boeing B-17F Bessie the Jap Smasher off Domo. All these dives were very good, but they are not of the same quality as the Chuuk Lagoon wrecks.

On Sunday 9 August we travelled to Tambea to dive the wreck of the Japanese submarine I-1 (it is not the I-123 as is often reported) and the coral caves of Tambea Reef. These were two excellent dives and well worth doing. Later in the week we dived the wreck of a Japanese Emily flying boat, the wharf at Ghavutu Island (excellent), the USS John Penn (also excellent) and a drift dive in Sealark Channel.

While we were there we attended a range of activities including a dawn service, film nights, cultural dancing displays and tours over the 8,300 ton USS Racine (a tank landing ship) and the Woodhole Institute's Laney Choust which discovered the wreck of the SS Titanic. Some members of the group met Dr Bob Ballard and became some of the first people in the world to see video of the wreck of the HMAS Canberra sitting upright over 800 metres below Iron Bottom Sound.


After a very action packed 10 days, the group from Shiprock Dive left very impressed with the diving and the celebrations and the trip was voted a success in every way.
