#### **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - AUGUST 1993**

Our Annual General Meeting will be held 16th August 1993.

Basically there are few requirements needed to hold a Committee position. Some positions may need certain experience or availability of equipment, but others do not require any specialised skills.

Being a Committee member is a great way to meet lots of members and others in the diving community.

If you are a little unsure as to what is required for each Committee position, here is a brief description.

**PRESIDENT:** Obviously the "top" person, they act as the chairperson for General Meetings (monthly) and Committee Meetings. Often the President acts as the "spokesperson" when required. You don't need to have any particular experience, as the President doesn't have a defined role, but you may need to organise people and "pitch" in when required.

**SECRETARY/PUBLICITY OFFICER:** Traditionally two positions, which can filled by one person if necessary.



Would be good if you had access to a typewriter but you don't need any particular experience (not even being able to spell!).

**SOCIAL SECRETARIES and DIVE ORGANISERS:** These may be individual positions or shared by a number of people. There is always a need for more than one person in these positions. No experience necessary, a great way to get involved in social activities, you could chose to organise just diving or mixed outings. All that needed is a telephone and enthusiasm

**PHOTOGRAPHIC OFFICER:** A key figure around AV time, this person is involved with organising and co-ordinating all aspects of the AV. You can delegate and are not expected to bear the lot entirely. You need to be organised, and have some knowledge of photography.

#### COMMONWEALTH GOVERNMENT MOVES TO SAVE OUR SHIPWRECKS

Important new measures designed to increase protection for Australia's historic shipwrecks were announced today by the Minister for Arts and Administrative Services, Senator Bob McMullan.

All shipwrecks aged 75 or more years old in Australian waters are now protected from disturbance, damage and plunder under the *Historic Shipwrecks Act 1976*. The blanket declaration of these shipwrecks is a major step forward in protecting and managing Australia's underwater heritage.

'Australia has a rich heritage of shipwrecks. They are an irreplaceable source of information about our past and are a major tourist and recreational attraction for the growing dive industry', the Minister said.

There are about 5000 shipwrecks around the Australian coast. Divers are encouraged to dive on wrecks, where safe, but must not disturb the site or remove relics. Anyone who discovers a wreck, or is in possession of a relic from a protected wreck, is required by law to report the discovery to the Minister.

'By expanding protection for shipwrecks, the Government is helping to ensure that irreplaceable archaeological information is not destroyed. By expanding protection for shipwrecks today, we will help to ensure that divers can continue to enjoy shipwreck sites a century from now', Senator McMullan said.

'By undertaking to manage our shipwreck heritage in a responsible way, the Government is demonstrating its continuing commitment to preserving our cultural inheritance', the Minister said.

The Historic Shipwrecks Act 1976 protects shipwrecks in Commonwealth waters, that is, below the low water mark and above the continental shelf. State and Northern Territory legislation protects wrecks in their waters. Serious penalties exist for people caught disturbing wreck sites.

The Department of Arts and Administrative Services is preparing Guidelines which explain the appropriate conditions of access to shipwreck sites for individuals and community groups. 

HISTORIC SHIPWRECKS ACT 1976

Declaration under Section 4A

- I, WENDY FRANCES FATIN, Minister of State for the Arts and Territories, pursuant to recommendations made by the Governments of all States, the Northern Territory and Norfolk Island, hereby declare, under subsections 4A(1), 4A(2), 4A(6) and 4A(7) of the Historic Shipwrecks act 1976, the remains of ships or articles associated with snips described below to be historic shipwrecks or historic relics:
- (1) all remains of ships (whether or not the existence and location of the remains are known) that are situated in Australian waters, or waters above the continental shelf of Australia, adjacent to the coast of a State, of the Northern Territory, of Norfolk Island or of any other Territory, and are at least 75 years old;
- (2) every article (whether or not the existence and location of the article are known) that

(a) was associated with a ship;

(b) is situated in Australian waters, or waters above the continental shelf of Australia, adjacent to the coast of a State, of the Northern Territory, of Norfolk Island or of any other Territory; and

(c) either -

- (i) was associated with the remains a ship that are at least 75 years old, or
- (ii) entered waters referred to in paragraph (b) at least 75 years ago.

This declaration extends to the remains of a ship or an article, that either remains in, or has been wholly or partly removed from, the waters described above.

This declaration applies also to remains or articles that become remains or articles described above after the date of this declaration, including remains or articles that do not yet exist.

## The National Historic Shipwrecks Program

The National Historic Shipwrecks Program is a cooperative undertaking between the Commonwealth, the states and the Northern Territory. The program aims to encourage public enjoyment and appreciation of our underwater cultural heritage by:

- conserving and protecting historic shipwreck sites and associated material as a cultural resource of the nation; and
- promoting the compilation and dissemination of information on Australian shipwrecks.

Shipwrecks are an invaluable source of archaeological information which can help us to understand Australia's past and are a great recreational attraction for divers. They also have potential for scientific research. People are welcome to dive on shipwreck sites, where safe, but must not disturb or damage the remains or take anything from them.

The Commonwealth's *Historic Shipwrecks Act 1976* automatically protects all shipwrecks aged 75 years or more in Australian waters, ie waters on the seaward side of the low water mark and above the continental shelf. More recent wrecks can also be protected by an individual declaration by the Minister. Eight wrecks have been so declared. Protected zones have also be declared around shipwrecks which are both particularly significant and especially vulnerable.

#### You are obliged under the Act to:

- not disturb a shipwreck site or remove any relic without a permit;
- not enter any of the 10 protected zones around historic shipwrecks without a permit;
- notify the Minister of the remains of any shipwreck you discover,
- notify the Minister of any protected shipwreck relic in your possession, custody or control;
- not damage or destroy a historic shipwreck relic, nor dispose of a historic shipwreck relic without a permit; and
- comply with any other power of the Minister or of an inspector under the Act.

For more information, see the Public Access Guidelines which are available on application. The Act also provides for recognition of persons who discover and report a shipwreck.

The Commonwealth, the states and the Northern Territory have established a national framework for surveying, assessing, managing and protecting historic shipwrecks. Some states have programs in which public participation in certain activities is welcome. The public can also join maritime archaeological associations in each state. The Commonwealth also works with the Australian Institute for Maritime Archaeology in promoting standards of practice and the dissemination of information on shipwrecks.

The Minister has delegated certain powers, including the granting of permits, to the relevant authority in each state and the Northern Territory.


