





- 3. Each slide must have been taken underwater by the entrant.
- 4. Fish tank, aquarium shots or shots taken that resulted in the injury of death of marine animals are not acceptable.
- 5. Any special effects are limited to "in camera" and unusual shots should be accompanied by a description of technique to avoid disqualification.
- 6. A novice is an entrant who has not won a place (1st, 2nd or 3rd) in any major underwater photographic competition or earned income from the sale of underwater photographs.
- 7. All slides are to be in glassless mounts with the entrant's name, slide name and a contrasting dot in the lower left corner when held to be viewed.
- 8. The judges decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 9. The Club has the right to use entered slides for the promotion of the competition, the Club or diving, at its discretion.
- 10. Entries must be submitted from film provided and processed by the Club. The slide film may be picked up from the Photographic Officer at the January Club meeting and MUST BE RETURNED BY THE MARCH CLUB MEETING TO THE PHOTOGRAPHIC OFFICER. They will then be processed and returned to the entrants for selection of their portfolio. The portfolio must then be submitted by the April meeting. The slides will be judged and the presentations will be made at the May meeting.

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

Entrants should select their slides to demonstrate the range of their technical ability as well as their creativity. That is, from macro through to wide angle. Slides will be judged individually for technical ability, composition and creativity, then they will be viewed as a portfolio and assessed for range and depth of ability.



AROUND THE CLUBS

TIKI AQUALUNG CLUB

Sorry I missed the deadline last month but we are behind schedule with everything. We've been flat out refitting the Tiki, a 50-ft. lugger, which we bought as a derelict. We went to Harry West, the sailmaker, to buy a new set of sails and they recognised the Tiki as the same lugger they made a suit of sails for previously. The owner then being Errol Flynn.

They told us that many years ago Errol and a Dr. Stevens sailed her around the South Sea Islands.

A big syndicate recently bought a 25,000-ton freighter, the Runic, that was wrecked, high and dry, on a coral reef known as Middleton Reef, 100 miles north of Lord Howe Island. They called down to see the Tiki as they wanted to buy a similar vessel to take about a dozen chaps to salvage the Runic. We won't sell the Tiki so they said they would like some of the Tiki club divers to go over as there were signs of other wrecks that might contain treasure or such. Some of our club sail next week for anything from 3 to 12 months on good money.

I see the girl deep divers stirred up a bit of interest. Actually Jean Kennedy was keen to take out the Aust. Ladies' deep diving record as the South Aust. Sea Urchins mentioned in the July-August issue that Gae Frearson equalled Heather Harding's State record at only 150 ft. According to the Victorian Aqualung Club (Sept. issue), Jill Ratcliffe, of East Brighton, a member of their club, is probably the holder at 210 ft. Now Carlo Fillipetti and Leo Griffiths, of the Port Kembla Club, put Jean through some secret trials last month and told me that Jean has no trouble at 200 ft., going straight down without a pause.

Knowing this, we had a bit up our sleeve over the 150-ft. divers and knew she had a good chance at a new record. However, now that the record, we'll say, is held by Jill Ratcliffe at 210 ft., our club would not be a party to encourage Jean. But she assures me she would welcome a challenge from any lady diver. As far as our club is concerned we will leave it at that. We haven't the divers to take her down deeper anyhow.

The club now has 20 financial members and all active members are expected to participate in two outings per month.

We were promised 10ft. visibility if the sun was shining and zero if not, so after much disorganised chaos (like bailing out a 30ft. x 8ft. barge), we finally decided to get into the water.

Six divers partook in this venture and it was really something to see them gliding down the barnacle encrusted mooring chain to the muddy bottom below. A circular sweep was carried out on the bottom using a 120ft. rope with divers equally spaced along it. After this sweep, all divers returned to the chain without having found the lung, whereupon Bob did a free ascent to the surface.

Another circular sweep was carried out 100 yards upstream, this time in 60ft of water. This met with success—right at the end of the rope Dennis found his lung. (Boy, was he happy?) After tying the lung to the sweep rope, we all returned to the surface with Bob Scott and Bob Wilson doing a free ascent to the surface.

Poor old Dennis (ever seen a dog with 10 tails?). He was sucking and blowing on that lung for half an hour — checking it, he said, to see if it's O.K. — before we took it away from him.

So, after searching and locating another mooring, we decided to head for home in our luxurious 13ft. cruiser.

In future, at our club outings, we hope to make a full-length movie film on all aspects of diving. This will be an instructional film covering such things as the "Bends", "Air Embolism", "Safety in the Water", etc. — so all you actors, TURN UP.

Must comment on Don who accidentally fell into the water without his suit on (accidentally?). Such a shame.

QUOTES FROM CLUB MINUTES

REGARDING INCORPORATION

A question was raised at the last Club Meeting and the following are <u>direct quotes</u> from Club Minutes on the subject of incorporation.

CLUB MINUTES

21 September, 1992

"Ron outlined the intent to incorporate the club.

He quoted an example where in an unrelated sport, members of the committee were liable for injuries suffered at a club function. Incorporation will protect the committee and every club member from liability charges. We have a major risk factor as club members offer the use of their own boats for club dives. At present the owners have no protection other than the disclaimer signed upon joining (membership application).

Club members were asked if anyone objected, PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

BJ mentioned that this subject had been raised previously, and apparently at that time, the solution was to upgrade the membership disclaimer. It is now felt that this may not be sufficient.

Proceedings and enquiries are under way, we will keep everyone informed."

MINUTES FROM MEETING 18 OCTOBER, 1993:

The Minutes were taken as read. All members have read minutes in last newsletter. Minutes were accepted and seconded.

INCOMING CORRESPONDENCE:

Ryde Underwater Club "Surface Interval", Uni. of NSW "Devious Undercurrents", UTS "No Douts", Underwater Research Group "Bulletin", Brisbane Waters Aqualung Club "Demand Valve Vibes", Sydney University U/W Club, Australian Underwater Federation, Pr Dive Huskisson - information package.

OUTGOING CORRESPONDENCE:

Terese Mayer has sent correspondence and newsletters to new members.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Leo Mayer gave the Treasurer's Report. Accepted by Rick Latimer, Seconded by Ron Mines.

PHOTOGRAPHIC OFFICER'S REPORT:

Paul Wildish mentioned that he and Leo Bergagnin had just returned from the Heron Island dive festival week. A dive report is detailed later in newsletter.

Paul then spoke on the Club's upcoming George Roberts Photographic Competition. There will be a new approach this year and its envisaged that entrants will be given rolls of Kodak Ektachrome film. The rolls of slide film will be distributed at the January Club meeting with the rolls to be returned at the March Club meeting and processed by Kodak ab North Ryde. The entrants can select which of their marked slides to enter and judging will be held in April. It's envisaged that judging may be held at Kodak's North Ryde facility. Kodak have offered the Club to conduct its George Roberts slide presentation night in their auditorium if required. This will be in May.

First Prize in the George Roberts Open Section will be 5 nights accommodation at Coffs Harbour with 6 boat dives at Solitary Islands sponsored by Dive Quest.

First Prize in the Novice Section will be 5 nights accommodation and 6 dives at South West Rocks sponsored by South West Rocks Dive Centre.

DIVE REPORTS BY MEMBERS:

Scott Leimroth reported on his recent Honiora dive in 63 metres of water. Scott also dived the Kello a couple of weeks ago, it was filthy, no yiz but he did see an inflatable sheep tied to the boiler.

Adam Smith has recently dived Seals Rocks, saw lots of fish life like tuna, 6 whales, a bronze whaler about 8-10 foot in size and a seal. There was about 10 metres viz but the water was 'green' an also with red algae.

Adam had just dived Cronulla, Mallabar areas that day. The water was warm and clear blue offshore. While on the dive he saw a flying fish and there was about 10 mtr. viz.

Michael McFadyen had a good dive on the Undola with 50-60 ft. viz. He had also dived Barons Hut on the Saturday, Cape Banks and Inscription Point.

Martin Kandilas then reported on the Club dive at Jervis Bay. About 6/7 club members had a good time even though the weather was a bit unsettled. On the Saturday Martin, Ross Hipwell, Leo and Terese Mayer dived Point Perpendicular with about 60 ft. viz. (really about 40 ft.) and the water was 'warm' (14 deg. !). On the dive they saw a blue devil fish near the anchor and heaps of nudibranchs. A Saturday afternoon BBQ extended into a evening BBQ that was quite social and Rick's chili spare ribs were appreciated.

On the Sunday Martin, Leo and Terese drove the boat to Murrays Beach but because there was a howling southerly they decided not to do a dive. (Leo and Terese were suffering from the after effects of the previous night).

Rick Latimer then reported on his dive on the Sunday with Ross Hipwell. They launched from Huskisson and dived east of Bowen Island. They did 2 very good dives, had about 40 ft. viz and it was clear on the bottom, but it was blowing a strong south-westerly wind. For the second dive Rick just drifted the boat a bit further south of the first dive. The second dive's viz was only about 20 ft. but still a good dive. The pies from the Husky cake shop were enjoyed after the dive. Rick reckons Martin didn't dive on the Sunday because he'd already washed and polished his boat on the Saturday afternoon!

Martin then said how 'accurate' the weather forecast can be. When he arrived Friday afternoon there was a howling 35 knot NE. Dive Log/Sportdiving Magazines

BJ asked the question of what Leo Bergagnin meant by "sorting out the terms and conditions with Barry Andrewartha"?

Leo Bergagnin then outlined that Barry has offered to pay \$1,000 on publication of the winning photographs. It is proposed there will be 1 full page each month in **Dive Log** magazine. The monthly articles will promote both the Club and the Australasian U/W Photographic Competition.

Barry has also offered to do a 2 page colour spread in each bi-monthly issue of **Sportdiving** magazine leading up to the competition. After the competition Barry will publish the competition's winning slides in the next 2 issues in the six page gatefold layout.

GENERAL BUSINESS (CONTINUED):

<u>Dive Log/Sportdiving Magazines</u> (Continued)

BJ mentioned that many years ago there had been some problems with Barry and that slides had gone astray and ended up in magazines under someone else's name. Is there to be an understanding about ownership of slides and to make sure there is proper recognition of the photographer. BJ asked for an official report of the discussions.

Leo B. said that it had been a very hard decision to make and that the Committee did actually have a tied vote of 3 to 3 with his casting vote as President. The lean was initally towards Scuba Diver but a decision was made to go with Dive Log / Sportdiving to better promote the Club and the presentation night. The decision was not solely made for financial reasons, but also to have the added benefit of access to a diving magazine with monthly circulation; i.e. Dive Log. Articles in Sportdiving magazine are bi-monthly.

Cathy Holloway (Scuba Diver) did have her advantages of both her past experinece and also being located here in Sydney.

Barry has offered a further dive industry sponsorship package of a \$10,000 package by bringing out an overseas guest speaker; similar to the present Bob Talbot promotion. But this offer didn't come into the decision at all. There has been no commitment as yet to take up this offer. Barry fully understands that we have chosen him for 1 year to start with.

Leo Bergagnin stressed that in order to make a timely decision that this was a Committee decision. A decision had to be made now to allow for the lead in time for the publication dates of the magazines. For example just when speaking to Barry in late October he already had his December-January issue ready for publication. Sportdiving magazine's February-March issue is soon to go to print. There are 2 bi-monthly issues left for Sportdiving magazine before the competition closes, but we also have the monthly Dive Log magazines.

Last year the members had left the same decision up to the previous Committee. At that time they had decided to stay with Cathy Holloway and Scuba Diver magazine.

Brian Colwell then spoke saying he can back up what Leo Bergagnin was explaining. Brian said that last year the same issue was thrown around and in the end the decision was left up to Ron and Brian. There had been discussions over 2 - 3 meetings that didn't go anywhere and in the end Ron made a decision to stay with Scuba Diver last year.

Club Shirts

BJ asked about the money spent on the Club shirts. It was brought to his attention that the Rules of Incorporation allow a Committee to make certain decisions on behalf of the Club. Leo Bergagnin said that he had paid for the shirts out of his own pocket and after the positive reaction when members were buying the shirts at the last Club meeting, Leo B. then asked to be reimbursed. There is a \$7.00 profit on each shirt that goes back into the Club's account. BJ asked if there should be a ceiling on how much a Committee can spend?

Incorporation

BJ then brought up the issue of Club incorporation. BJ said he had raised the question last month of not knowing about the decision to incorporate the Club.

Sue brought up the point that the Club members generally wont make decisions and all had been left up to the last Committee. The Rules of Incorporation were in place by July this year. Robert Rubesa asked about the JB issue mentioned in the last Newsletter. He asked if there was to be any form of petition or letter from the Club against the proposed Navy plans for Jervis Bay. Terese Mayer said she had placed the story in the last Newsletter because she felt strongly on the subject. It had been placed there for club members' information to possibly stimulate some into writing to protest on the issue. To try and get signatures on a petition from 'slack' members would be pretty hard to do. The Committee could certainly draft up a letter on behalf of the Club Members stating its opposition to the Navy proposal. This is to be followed up.

- <u>Christmas B-B-Q</u>: BJ asked why the Club is providing beer, wine and soft drinks and a hamper at the Christmas BBQ and why not meat? Joe Ingegneri said that if the members gave him definite numbers of attendance it would be easier to work out how much to provide at functions.
- <u>Club BBQ Hosted by Karin Smith & Peter Booth</u>: Leo Mayer thanked Karin for providing the venue for the last Club BBQ. Everyone who attended had a good time.

MEETING CLOSED at around 9.10 p.m.

Around 15 months ago Lyn and Pat Manly, two of Australia's best-known and most popular photojournalists were both stricken with Malaria after a 6 week stay in Papua New Guinea and the Solomons.

Due to inaccurate diagnosis Lyn and Pat were belatedly hospitalised and Lyn died. Pat's recovery was slow but he was eventually confirmed as out of danger and was released from

But a near-lifetime marriage to a childhood sweetheart had ended. Pat had lost a wonderful partner, one who not only

sustained their family, but also worked with him to achieve international recognition for them both as photojournalists.

For Pat, recovering from Malaria proved to be easier than recovering from the loss of his wife. He was always a superb photographer and technician, but he struggled to establish new direction. He had continued and loving support from his close friends throughout these difficult times and appeared to us all to have re-built his life.

But despite appearances all wasn't well — on Sunday 21 November Pat Manly took his own life and we were devastated at the news. We can only hope and pray Pat has at last again found the happiness and contentment he and Lyn shared for so many years.
