PHOTOGRAPHIC OFFICER's MESSAGE

Don't forget that the George Roberts Competition starts at the next Club Meeting Monday 17 January. There will be a new approach this year and entrants will be given rolls of Kodak Ektachrome film at the January Club meeting. The rolls are to be returned at the March Club meeting and Kodak will be processing them at their North Ryde complex. (The film and developing will cost each entrant \$15). Once the film is back the entrants can select which of their marked slides to enter and judging will be held in April. It's envisaged that judging may be held at Kodak's North Ryde facility and Kodak have also offered the Club to conduct its George Roberts slide presentation night in their auditorium if required. This will be in May.

First Prize in the George Roberts Open Section will be 5 nights accommodation at Coffs Harbour with 6 boat dives at Solitary Islands sponsored by Dive Quest. First Prize in the Novice Section will be 5 nights accommodation and 6 dives at South West Rocks sponsored by South West Rocks Dive Centre. 

- 5. Any special effects are limited to "in camera" and unusual shots should be accompanied by a description of technique to avoid disqualification.
- 6. A novice is an entrant who has not won a place (1st, 2nd or 3rd) in any major underwater photographic competition or earned income from the sale of underwater photographs.
- 7. All slides are to be in glassless mounts with the entrant's name, slide name and a contrasting dot in the lower left corner when held to be viewed.
- 8. The judges decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 9. The Club has the right to use entered slides for the promotion of the competition, the Club or diving, at its discretion.
- 10. Entries must be submitted from film provided and processed by the Club. The slide film may be picked up from the Photographic Officer at the January Club meeting and MUST BE RETURNED BY THE MARCH CLUB MEETING TO THE PHOTOGRAPHIC OFFICER. They will then be processed and returned to the entrants for selection of their portfolio. The portfolio must then be submitted by the April meeting. The slides will be judged and the presentations will be made at the May meeting.

Dive history may sound like a dull subject, right out of the schooldays but I can assure you that with the two speakers that we have, it will be anything but dull.

TOM BYRON is the author of many well known & well researched guide books about diving the east coast of NSW. Tom has now turn this ability to research & to write, to a labour of love, the recording of the history of scuba diving in Australia. He is compiling this information from the people who actually made this history & recording it so that it is not lost forever. Each person involved has their own story to tell about the days of diving before "off - the - shelf courses, equipment & regulations". Tom will show archival slides & retell some of these incidents that have shaped diving into what it is today.

MAX GLEESON an author & researcher who has just published his second book. 



With over 300 illustrations, his book has all the pictorial richness that helped make bestsellers of Robert Ballard's two previous books. The Discovery of the Trainic and The Discovery of the Bismank. Haunting pictures of the wreeks are paired with photographs of the ships in their prime; a spectacular full-page foldout reveals the USS Quinty and the Canhornic, painted in accurate detail by maritime artist Ken Marschall. Full-color maps and diagrams plus a host of paintings and present-alsy photographs help to both re-create this extraordinary chapter in the history of the Pacific war and convey the excitement of modern miderwater exploration.

Dr. Robert D. Ballard is known around the world for his explorations or both the *Thame* and the legendury hardesnio *Binnarie*. But he is also one of the world's foremost occanographers, and has for many years used submersibles to explore the occan depths and chart their hidden features.

He is also founder of the JASON Foundation for Education, a nonprofit organization that involves school children in live electronic field trips. Since its

first expedition in 1989, the JASON Project has involved more than one million students around the world in its live interactive programs.

Dr. Ballard works with his wife, Barbara Earle Ballard, who is President of Odyssey Corporation and Odyssey Expeditions which developed, orga-

nized, and executed the two expeditions to from Bortom Sound that resulted in this book as well as a television special by the National Geographic Society. Odyssey and Dr. Ballard are involved in a number of other projects including a novel with Tony Chiu enti-tled Bright Share, a television adventure series with Seven Spielberg called Saquers, and a new expedition to the remains of the RMS Lustrana.

Rick Archbold worked closely with Robert Ballard in the research, organization, and writing of this book. A Canadian editor and writer, he has also collaborated with Dr. Ballard on The Discourty of the Titanic and The Discourty of the Simunt's and is currently at work on a biography of Robert Ballard for young reading the programment of the programment
