

DIVE REPORTS

MYOLA DIVE

The plan.

- 1. To meet at Rose Bay at 8.00 am
- 2. To take the magnetometer for a test run over the wreck of the Myola with the assistance of Peter Fields the discoverer of the wreck.
- 3. To dive the Myola
- 4. To test the mag over some shallower

wrecks in the harbour.

The plan starts off badly Leo B is late again blaming traffic and traffic lights and anything else he could think of for his bad timing. In reality he is always bloody late!!!!

The morning weather was a typical Sydney Autumn day pleasant but slightly overcast. Unfortunately the seas were a little bit sloppy, maybe if we had all been on time they would have been flatter.

After battling the swell we finally arrived at the Myola and anchored on. By the time we had geared up we realised we were off the wreck and the anchor was firmly entrenched in the reef unfortunately pulled away. We decided to proceed with the dive and would locate the wreck once on the ocean floor.

Upon entering the water we were greeted with blue warm water, about 30 m + vis, the best Sydney had seen for a while.

We descended to the bottom where Jackie's gear decided to malfunction and she was forced to return to the surface, steam could be seen coming off her ears!!

Peter Flockart & Leo proceeded to locate the wreck some 50m from the anchor. A huge cuttlefish that was lurking near the prop greeted us. After rummaging through various crevices looking for goodies we swam up to the boiler before noticing our bottom time and returning to the anchor. The recovery of the anchor proved difficult due to it being wedged firmly in the reef. After 25 mins we left the ocean floor with the prospect of a 50min-deco time ahead. Boy was Fieldsy impressed!!!!!!.NOT!!!

While on deco we saw lots of interesting plankton drifting by but the highlight was the appearance of two, one metre long wahoo swimming past. No we weren't hallucinating!!!!

By this time the seas were too rough to run the mag over the Myola so we head straight back into the harbour where we carried out a series of tests over the Centurion and the Centennial. The mag appears to work satisfactorily but we feel we should more often to determine its range.

CANCELLED DIVES

The Ulladulla trip for the 1st and 2nd May was cancelled due to 6-7m waves, hail and huge rainstorms. Apparently the viz wasn't all that great either!! I have re-scheduled the trip to the 24th and 25th July.

I also had to cancel the search day on Sunday, 15th May due to a lack of available boats. It seems that all the boats were headed to dive the Tuggerah that Sunday for the Tuggerah's 80th anniversary. I have re-scheduled this day to Sunday, 6th June (with the second club search day still happening on Sunday, 18th July).

UPCOMING DIVES AND DIVE TRIPS

We've got a heap of dives and dive trips organised for the next couple of months. If you'd like to come to any of these please let me know (preferably before the dives) or leave a

message on the club phone.

Jervis Bay weekend: Peter Flockart has organised a weekend on the MV Indulgence this coming weekend (Friday 21st may to Sunday 23rd May) I believe that there are still 2-3 places left. \$275 for the weekend, which covers all dives, food and accommodation on the boat. Please call Peter direct about this if you would like to come along.

Club Search Day: Sunday 6th June. The first club search day has been re-scheduled for this day. On this day, we will be showing club members how the magnetometer works by using it over a known wreck for a while and then search some "obstructions" on the sea charts. Bring your dive gear. If we find something, we can dive it; otherwise, we can always dive a known wreck and have another go with the mag on the next search day. Cost of the boat for the day to be shared amongst the divers.

Terrigal/Norah Heads: June long weekend (12th, 13th and 14th June). Cost of \$30 per dive or \$55 per double dive with Terrigal Dive Centre. Accommodation is still being arranged. Come up for a day or two or three. Dives include Foggy's Cave, the Skillion and the wreck of the Kiama.

The Bombo, Wollongong: Sunday, 27th June Double Dive 8am and 12pm. There are only a couple of places left for this dive on the morning and lunchtime dives. Please let me know ASAP if you would like to come on this dive. Cost will be about \$15 to 20 per person per dive.

Coolooli (Long reef) and Midway Reef: Sunday 11th July. Leaving 7am (sharp) from Rose Bay wharf. Cost \$60 for the double dive (including a light lunch). Back about 1.30pm.

<u>Club Search Day</u>: Sunday 18th July. Second club search day.

<u>Ulladulla weekend</u>: 24th and 25th July. Same deal as in May. \$160 includes 4 dives (2 dives on Brush Island on the Saturday, 3 airfills and 2 night's accommodation at the lodge next door to the dive shop (and a 1-minute walk from the pub and the shops). We can also do a night dive if any one wants to.

With all of these dives, I really need to know who's coming to what dive. If you put your name down for a dive - please let me know if

you later decide you can't make it. Equally, if you decide that you are coming - please tell me. Cheers and good diving,

SOMETHING DIFFERENT

Here is the fourth in the series "Nudibranchs around Sydney".

COMMON NAME (None Known)

SCIENTIFIC NAME :

: Polycera capensis

DISTRIBUTION

:Originally from Sth

Africa, it is now common along the NSW Coast.

HABITAT

: Rocky reef and weed.

DEPTH RANGE

: 0 - 22 m

ADULT SIZE

80 mm

NOTES:

This nudibranch represents one of the harmless arrivals from overseas via ships bilge water. First documented along the NSW coast in 1956 by Prof Dakin in Australian Seashores, who noted that it occurred in great numbers in the Spring / Summer months when the blue green algae Bulga sp is at its most abundant.

The animal colour is a greenish white with several black patches; a yellow stripe runs from the gills to the end of the tail.

Pistule, tentacles and rhinophores are yellow with the gills a dark green

The head has six tentacles, which are well evident also, the rhizophores and gills, which are protected from predators by a basket, shaped pistule.

The 4th June will mark the anniversary of the Battle of Midway some 57 years ago. In the April edition of National Geographic there is an article on the battle, which saw the destruction of a large part of the Japanese fleet. It also saw the sinking of the American aircraft carrier Yorktown by a Jap submarine.

The article details the search and subsequent discovery of this carrier in 16,650 feet of water on May 2nd 1998 by Robert Ballard. It has good photos and a computer enhanced drawing of the wreck-sitting upright on the bottom.

The 23 pages devoted to the article make for engrossing reading.
