Nikon LS 2000 \$ 2598.00

I was able to price two scanners:

Kodak Digital 4802 IDE CD – R/RW \$506.00

Ricoh RW 226 \$895.00

How true this article is, I'm not sure so a call was placed to the department of foreign Affairs. Advice was given to avoid the Solomon's unless on essential business due to the current racial tensions. We have abandoned this trip and are now off to Vanuatu:

DIVE REPORTS

On Sunday the 10th July, Peter's Flockart 7 Foster, Jackie R, Leo B and Tom B departed from Rose Bay aboard Southern Comfort and motored to the north side to dive the scuttled bucket dredge - Coolooli lying in 48 metres of water off Long Reef. On the way we stopped at Long Reef to collect an unknown diver. This person was a mobile dive store leading other divers to query whether we had picked up a hawker of dive gear. To the best of our memory some of the equipment on offer was twin tanks, nitrox hang tank, three computers a watch, curved around the forearm slate with dive tables, numerous kn9ves torches strobe lift bag B/C wings and an EPIRB. Curiously looking at him as he climbed aboard a somewhat confused Leo B was heard to ask the obvious question where "the xyz abc !!" are you going to dive. We then proceeded to the dive site where Leo B suggested to a similarly attired Tom Byron you two guys should buddy together. Tom's reply - NO!! (The author has paraphrased Tom's reply)

Before we entered the water a large dusky albatross alighted on the water near the boat. As we stepped into the blue water and before descending to the wreck several divers were greeted by a seal, which quickly swam off. The limp rope and chain of the anchor lay next to

the stern of the Coolooli indicating a distinct lack of current.

On the wreck was sighted a purple fairy basselet, a fish normally found in tropical waters but very much at home here. In one of the compartments some gauges with glass are still visible. Underneath the wreck one of the divers located a sink whose taps can still be turned. However no water comes out these days.!!!

While completing deco the divers saw a number of long Salps floating by in the water column.

We reboarded the boat and headed back to Long Reef to drop off the mobile dive store before anchoring in calmer water for cup of soup. After a surface interval of 1 hr 30 mins we set off for the second dive site - Midway Reef.

This was a pleasant reef dive with plenty of colour but very little fish life and after reboarding Southern Comfort enjoyed a pleasant trip back to Rose Bay.

Underwater Photography Basics (Part 1)

This article is the first of a series on underwater photography. We will first look at the basics of underwater photography and then concentrate on point and shoot cameras in housings and



the Sea & Sea Motormarine II EX amphibious camera. Later topics include wide angle and macro techniques, advanced topics, and finally Nikonos and housed SLR systems.

One of the more important things to understand about underwater photography is that it is very dim down there. Our eyes are marvels of imaging hardware and along with the software encoded in the brain we can accommodate very well to the low light levels, however the camera cannot. Not only is there limited light available, but it is pretty much one color, blue (or green in temperate waters). This is due to the selective color absorption of water, the opposite of a red sunset. So if you want to see color deeper than 3m, you need a flash unit (strobe).

Another thing to realize about underwater photography is that there is a lot of stuff in the water besides water (also why it's so dim). These suspended particles block light and create backscatter from your strobe. So not only do you need a strobe, you need to place it correctly to minimize lighting the water between your subject and the camera--usually up and to the left (more on this later). I noticed a remarkable difference with an Ikelite aquashot when I started using the accessory slave strobe instead of the internal flash. Nonetheless, it is still possible to get great shots using only the internal flash on a point and shoot camera, particularly in clear water.

So it's dim and cloudy underwater. That makes it even more important to get close to your subject, to minimize the "stuff" you have to shoot through. Many point and shoot cameras only allow you to get 1 metre away from your subject, so get that close. Even a very powerful strobe won't light a subject more than 2 metres away effectively. This is why wide angle lenses are the



lenses of choice for underwater shooting as they allow you to get closer, but more on that later. Part of the whole art of underwater photography is being stealthy and getting close to your quarry. Finally there's the background. If you want a dim or black background, get deep and point your camera down. If you want some light in your background, stay shallow and point up. So not only do you have to get close to your subject, you want to try and get below it, remembering not hit the bottom and stir up all the backscatter particulate we've talked about avoiding. This is why buoyancy is critical in underwater photography, make sure you practice it extensively before picking up the camera. So it's dim, monochromatic and cloudy down there, you have to get close and shoot up. You must have a flash if you want to see color, and have it separate from the camera if you want to avoid particle backscatter. Confused yet? Wait, we've only just begun. Next time we'll get more specific about camera settings on housed point and shoots and the Sea and Sea Motormarine II and the many inherent trade-offs.




Photo Tip

How not to forget your photo equipment when packing for a vacation.

Set your camera up completely with lens (es) and strobe(s) before you pack it. Then break it down piece by piece and put it into a photo case. Do the same for your wide-angle and close-up/macro setup also.
