

# A SLICE OF HISTORY

On Sunday, December 10, sixteen year old Jeff Corner, South Australian Junior Spearefishing Champion was attacked and killed by a white pointer shark at Caracalinga Heads near Aldinga.

Dave Burchell made a scuba dive to 215 feet to create a South Australian deep diving record.

The first group dive tour in Australia attracted 40 divers who were taken on a four day trip to Broughton Island over the Easter long weekend.

The 1962 South Australian Spearfishing Champion Rodney Fox was attacked by a white pointer shark at Aldinga, close to the area Brian Rogers attack took place in 1961. Fox was bitten under the arm and needed over 200 stitches. He survived the attack to become one of Australia's most authoritative guide tour leaders to the great white shark areas of South Australia.

#### 1963

Ben Cropp won the World Underwater Photographer of the Year Award in America with his film called "Shark Safari."

#### 1964

First Sea Tite underwater housing made in Australia was made in December by Barry Davies. The first Sea-Tite housing was designed and manufactured in Europe in 1959.

Melbourne scuba diver Henri Bource lost his left leg in a shark attack at a seal colony on Lady Julia Percy Island on November 26. The shark was a white pointer.

# **HISTORIC SHIPWRECK ACT 1976:**

The legislation does not stop divers using most historic wreck site for recreation, but they must not interfere with the wreck in any way. Some historic wrecks lie within protected no-entry zones and entry into this zone is prohibited without permit. To find out what areas are protected zones and information on how to apply for a permit you should contact the historic shipwreck Delegate in your State or Territory. Anyone who finds the remains of a historic ship, or an article associated with a historic ship, needs to notify the authorities as soon as possible and to give information about what has been found and its location.

# HOW NOT TO GET BENT

### From an old Fathom Dive Magazine

Professional divers Mal McLeod and Warner Power, both of Sydney, suffered severe attacks of the bends while working in the Solomon Islands. They attempted to re-compress with additional diving, but this probably added to their complaint. Mal McLeod, barely conscious and unable to walk, and Warner Power, who was paralysed on his left side, were both flown back to Sydney in an Air Force Hercules transport. From there they were rushed to the Naval Hospital at Balmoral and placed in the re-compression chamber for five and a half hours.

Mal McLeod is the nephew of Wally Gibbons, one of Australia's leading divers. Warner is brother of Alam Power, author of The Great Barrier Reef in

Dr Carl Edmonds who was in charge of treatment, summarised their accident:
"The details of the dive, they themselves don't know. They did not have depth meters, just am 'SOS decompression meter'. Both divers had the belief that you can't get into trouble with a 72 cubic foot tank, which is quite wrong. In fact, four out of the last six people treated here have got the bends while using a 72 cubic foot tank. Furthermore, it is doubtful that decompression meters are good for calculating a second dive on the same day.

"It's alright if you don't go beyond 30 feet on you r second dive, but where Warner Power went wrong was by going back into the water a third time while assisting McLeod to decompress. When this was the case, he should have combined both dive times to calculate his decompression. This is where their errors were made. They didn't understand the principles of diving.

"The SOS decompression meter is inaccurate when making a second dive on the same day. The manufacturers claim the meter has a six hour memory bank. Decompression must be calculated on a 24 hour scale. I'd advise anyone not to take the SOS meter below 180 feet as readings can be quite inaccurate. These, are opinions which we have tested. In this case where Power and McLeod relied on the meters. Power suffered a cerebral bubble (bubble in the brain) which paralysed the left side of his body. McLeod developed a bubble high up in his spinal cord. He would have ended up with paralysis in both hands, although he could have moved his shoulders and legs. We had both men placed on oxygen before and during their flight back to Australia.

This seems to have had a good result in minimising damage, and also helped with the recompression when they arrived.

"Power is all right now, but McLeod will take quite a few months before he is able to walk

around properly. At this stage it is still guess work to know if McLeod will have any disabilities. He still has a small bubble in the spinal cord which we are hoping to remove."

When admitted to the Naval Hospital, Warner Power and Mal McLeod were placed in a re-compression chamber with an atmosphere equal to 60 feet. Both breathed pure oxygen during this time. Normally the procedure is to return divers to 165 feet, but not on pure oxygen.
