BLAST FROM THE PAST

FIRST UNDERWATER MOVIE PHOTOGRAPHS OF A SHARK KILL: 1960

The first underwater photographs of a shark kill were recently taken at Rottnest Island. The pictures were black and white and one in the series featured on the front page of the "Daily News".

Mick Coleman speared the six-foot (2 metres) 100 lbs grey nurse shark off the western end of Rottnest Island. He got into difficulties and was compelled to land on the island minus mask and snorkel.

Club mate, Alf Thomas noticed his plight and swam from the boat to the island with a spare mask and snorkel.

The shark, found thirty minutes later by Kay Ridley, was dead. The spear was embedded close to the spine and still attached by the spear cord of the gun. Ridley towed the shark plus an exhausted club mate and his catch of fish a mile back to the boat.

The photographs taken were in 35 mm black and white stills, as well as 16 mm movie black and white.

This is the first photographs of a shark kill in Western Australia.
