

AQUATIC RESERVES

NSW Fisheries have just released a consultation paper on the proposed introduction of 15 Aquatic reserves up and down the coast on rocky foreshores. So, what is an aquatic reserve? I hear you ask. Well to many of us it is a place like Fly Point, Halifax Park (Nelson Bay) and Shiprock (Sydney).

These places are fully protected ie no Fishing, no anchoring, no extractive activities. That is the true meaning of a sanctuary area.

So what are fisheries proposing well not quite the above. Basically you can still catch cray fish, abalone and do line fishing. So the only protection is to fixed growth. The protection goes 100 meters from the high tide mark.

So for Divers it would offer a slight improvement on the current situation. Following is a copy of a detailed examination of the proposal by a person I know who is very protection orientated.

Tudibaring Head; Barrenjoey Head; Narabeen Head; Shelly Beach; Bronte-Coogee; La Perouse; Boat Harbour; Brickyard Point; Bass Point; Bombo Head; Inyaada Head; Preservation Point; Warden Head (Ulladulla) and Wagonga Head.



BLAST FROM THE PAST

1964

For the first time in Australia, television station TCN9 in Sydney ran a program for scuba divers and spearfishermen every Saturday morning. The program was called "Focus on Skindiving" and was hosted by Wally Reynolds.

In July Del Fielding became the first woman to dive the deep wreck of the *Birchgrove Park* that sank in a storm off the coast of Sydney.

Kathy Trout, a 17 year old girl, became the first lady to dive to 302 feet and set a new deep diving record for women.

1965

Ron Taylor is the only competition spearfisherman to win the Australian Spearfishing Titles 4 times in a row, 1962, 1963, 1964 and 1965.

Ron Taylor wins the Worlds Spearfishing Championships in Tahiti, and is the first Australian to do so. Other members of the team were Peter Kernp, Wally Gibbins and George Davies. Overall in the world Championships Australia came second.

1066

South Australian diver Dave Birchell conceives the idea of locating the HMAS *Perth.* He eventually dived on the wreck in Sunda Straits.

1967

Champion underwater fisherman Bob Bartle was attacked and bitten in half by a huge white pointer shark at Jurian Bay 155 miles north of Perth.

The Australian Underwater Fishing Championships for the first and only time so far, was won by two competitors, John Black and Vic Ley.

Dave Burchell of South Australia received the British Empire medal for services to diving. Birchell discovered the HMAS Perth single handed. In diving circles it is considered one of the most outstanding achievements in the history of the sport.

Valerie Taylor is the only lady so far to win the Ladies Spearfishing Championships three times in a row, 1965, 1966 and in 1967.
