





OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

January 2003

Qld dive firm fined \$20,000 over diver drowning

CAIRNS: A Cairns-based diving firm has been fined \$20,000 over Workplace Health and Safety breaches relating to the death of a diver off Thursday Island in June 2000. Oceantech Pty Ltd pleaded guilty in the Thursday Island Industrial Magistrates Court to failing to ensure the health and safety of its workers.

The court was told diver Fred Banu drowned while collecting sea cucumbers. An investigation found his air supply line had been caught between the stern of the dory to which he was attached and the leg of an outboard motor. The air line was also found to be significantly weaker than the Australian standard.

Qld Govt to tighten recreational diving safety code

BRISBANE: The Queensland Government will tighten safety regulations for recreational diving after a spate of snorkelling deaths.

The Government is drafting changes to diving codes of practice after the deaths of four men – in their 20s and all apparently fit – in snorkelling accidents since mid-December. At least two of the deaths may have been caused by a syndrome known as "shallow water blackout", in which snorkellers hyperventilate in order to stay underwater longer.

The Industrial Relations Department's Workplace Health and Safety Division has posted a snorkelling safety alert on its website and confirmed officers were drafting safety code changes which could be implemented within weeks.

Trial unlikely over diver death in Gulf of Carpentaria

CAIRNS: A diver who disappeared while working on a cyclone mooring system in the Gulf of Carpentaria almost three years ago looked tired when on the surface not long before he went under and did not come back up, an inquest heard recently.

The inquest into the disappearance of Marcus Williams, 29, was completed in the Cairns Coroner's Court recently with coroner Trevor Black indicating the likelihood of anyone being committed for trial over the incident was low.

Endeavour Shipping, the Queensland company for which Mr Williams was working at the time of his disappearance and subsequent death, already has been convicted of Workplace Health and Safety breaches over the incident, receiving a \$10,000 fine for not maintaining dive plans or logs.
