




WHAT'S BUBBLING

Whilst supporting our sponsors – well actually using a supporters raffle prize, I was treated to a great dive off Sea Tamer II – well great under the circumstances compliments of Mother Nature. She was just seeing how keen we were to dive. And the divers won!

The sea's were up to around a 2/2.5 mtr swell with a strong south easter whipping up the seas. I was so pleased that Max and Steve knew how to handle the boat properly in the seas and swell, but that didn't stop a few 'green' waves washing over the cabin and splashing those brave enough to sit near their tanks.

All the problems were on the surface as after the first 6 or so meters the water was great, no current or any signs of an angry sea other than - not so clear water. Viz was between 5-10 mtrs.

Well Fish Reef was true to name with plenty of both fish and colourful sponge life, from the minute nudi's to a huge ray gracefully gliding by. We saw rather large school full of Old wives, with many and varied fish species. Even a few 'great for dinner' snappers were swimming around. Lots of starfish in a range of sizes and colours. Lots of rock ledges to investigate and swim along. I believe a decent size cuttle fish took a liking to one of the other male divers.

The dive was well rounded off with hot soup, fresh bread, nibbles and chocolates which were a great pick me up after an awkward exit from the water.

All in all a fun time was had by all.



Boat Dive Card

Sydney Divercity will introduce a pre-paid "Boat Dive Card" to become effective from the first of April for a trial period of six months. The boat dive card will allow a substantial saving on boat dives offered by Sydney Divercity.

During this trial period the pre-paid Boat Dive Card will only be offered to South Pac club members, as a study for acceptability and usage. On completion of the trial period we will examine the rate of usage and determine if it should continue as a service offered to everybody.

This is how it should work. The card will be for *eight standard dives, pre-paid for a cost of \$200.00, which represents a boat dive for \$25.00, a saving of \$10.00 on our usual fee of \$35.00.

The cardholder will be required to ring the shop and book a position on the boat before the Wednesday prior to the weekend intended for the dive. At the time of booking your card will be marked and your name placed on the passenger list. No shows and cancellations with less than 24 hours notice will not receive a refund. Cancellations by the shop because of weather or insufficient numbers will attract a refund

Trial Period: 1st April 03 to 1st October 03

Boat Dive Card: 8 standard dives \$200.00

- The holder of the card can use all dives at a single booking (take a bunch of friends along) or individually over a period of time.
- When South Pac members book the whole boat, Sydney
 Divercity will provide a sausage sizzle BBQ free of charge
 (BYO drinks)

Remember this card is for a trial period only and will depend on the divers using it regularly if it is to become a permanent feature. If you are a keen diver you cant afford to be without this card.

Exclusions: Yes there are some exclusions, the dive card is for standard dives ONLY and not for the deep technical dives where the divers will be using twin tanks, blended air mix's or if hang tanks and deco bars are required to be put in place. It can be used on night dives but a \$5.00 additional charge will be made.
