# SPDC's CONSTITUTIONAL COLUMN # 1

The very first thing that must be stressed here, is that this column is written to enlighten those that are interested in understanding, but must not be considered a definitive legal view on the issue and any person wishing to gain such a legal understanding will have to seek such advice from a duly trained person in such legal matters.

What is an Incorporated Association?

It is an inexpensive means of establishing an **entity recognised by law.** It is an alternative to forming a company and is particularly suitable for small, community-based groups.

An Incorporated Association must have a Committee and an appointed Public Officer.

Every Incorporated Association must have documented Rules.

In SPDC's case, these rules are called, "MODEL RULES OF INCORPORATION FOR SOUTH PACIFIC DIVERS CLUB INC. MAY 1994.

There have been amendments made to our Model Rules and these are included as such at the rear of the Rules compilation and have been ratified by the Dept of Fair Trading.

For the sake simplicity, I will call the Model rules the Constitution from herein and any subsequent issues of this column.

I have not been able to get a direct answer from anyone at this point, but it appears that the initial reason for incorporating the Club was that as society entered a litigation era and remains so, the members in the early 80s had the foresight to see what could happen and took the pro-active step to protect the membership.

Part II, Sect 6 of our Constitution;

The Members of the Association shall have no liability to contribute towards payment of debts and liabilities of the Association, or the costs, charges and expenses of the winding up of the Association, except to the amount of any unpaid membership fees.

As we can see there is very sound reason for all members to accept that incorporation has it's merits in just this clause alone. Keep in mind that nothing exonerates a person or persons of responsibility for their actions, from serious neglect or blatant breaches of the Act, Regulations and Rules.

Our Constitution demands that we have a committee and the minimum committee is the office bearers, these being;

The President.

The Secretary.

The Treasurer.

We also need a Public Officer, but this can be anyone that is appointed and accepts such a position and this can be held by one of the above three and most often is.

These executive office bearers are the CEO management

Team of the Club and all other positions active as Committee positions are called Ordinary Committee positions and are subordinate to the Executive Committee.

This means that any decision made by the Committee as a whole has to have majority approval by the Executive Committee to be an accepted final Committee decision. Part III, section 16, Clause (e) of our Constitution; Ordinary Committee Members must refer back to the Office Bearers of the Committee for final approval of all decisions or actions.

What this achieves is accountability and transparency at Committee level by the Committee and clearly defines who wields the power at Committee level. The great thing about our Constitution is that no one person holds any power, but instead power at Committee level is held equally and democratically by the three Executive Officers, who are accountable to the general membership at all times. The important essence of our Constitution is that it was designed to give ultimate power to the General Membership and thereby being as democratic as is possible.

Membership of SPDC Inc is open to everbody, but acceptance of membership is expressly controlled by the Committee's right to consider all applications for Membership.

Next issue I shall deal with Membership and it's rights and obligations in detail, but here I will just touch on the subject lightly.

To be a Member of SPDC Inc and be able to vote on all or any issue, a member must be a financial member. The Club's financial membership year is from the 1st January to the 31st of December. If we as members fail to pay our membership dues on or before the 31st of December on any year, then we cease to become financial members and hence our voting rights and privileges also cease. Continuity of membership is maintained, as there is provision for a period of non-payment of dues for (1) one month that allows dues to be paid with out loss of membership continuity. If at the 1st of February of the membership year, dues are still not paid, then membership to SPDC Inc is terminated and all rights Privileges and positions held are forfeited and ones name is removed from the membership register.

# Part II, Section 3, clause © (iii) Yearly Club fee will be determined by a vote of acceptance from Members.

It can be taken from this that our yearly dues are not set in concrete and are really up for determination on a yearly basis.

#### Consideration

Perhaps business immediately after installing a new Committee at the AGM should be to consider this as the first business of the year and decide on the fore or against of raising membership dues to stay in touch fiscally with the times.

### Boat dive with Divercity

On Sunday 15/02/04, skipper Don gave a pre-dive talk of a wreck located on the eastern side of Henry's Head, the wreck of the "Advance".

Calm and clear water welcomed us as we descended the anchor in 7 metre of water, after swimming around on barren rocks we headed south-west to Henry's Head and deeper water. Here visibility improved and water temperature dropped to 17 deg as we passed through a thermocline.

This was the most interesting part of the dive, with a couple of large cuttle fish, one large green moray eel protecting its rocky surrounds, and various sponges typical of this site. Back into shallower water we came across all that remains of the "Advance" some rusted and twisted ribs and scattered bricks, possibly used for ballast.

The "Advance" was a schooner of 59 tonnes, length 21.9m, beam 5.9m, built in Auckland in 1874.

She crashed into rocks on Henry's Head on 12/06/1902 with the loss of one member of crew.

Max. depth 20 metre Bottom time 1:10 Water temp (min) 17 deg
