DIVE REPORTS

Scott and Martin dived the Tuggerah, reporting that the "idol" has been moved out onto the sand. Michael McFadyen out that the object was placed there as a joke.

Michael McFadyen dived SW rocks. He did a drift dive starting near the mouth of the Macleay River and drifting around the breakwall. The dive was about a kilometre long, the first time he dived it the dive duration was 46 minutes, the second dive took 89 minutes. The depth was on average 3-5m up to 15m. The water temperature was 25°C with lots of tropical fish life, rays, turtles.

He also dived Fish Rock, the Pinnacles, and an artificial reef near Wreck Bay. It mainly consisted of tyres, buoys (and a hills hoist) with lots of fish already attracted to the site.

There were two boats for the club dive; Michael McFadyen, George Nichol and Scot Leimroth dived from Rick Latimer's boat. Trevor and Debbie Sanderson dived from John Beddie's boat. The sea condition were rough with a large swell, so the plan was the dive a "wall" at Jibbon Reef. There was debate as to weather they actually found the wall, and the visibility ranged from terrible to nothing. Dive classification: "..for the sake of getting wet dive".

Michael McFadyen and John Beddie dived JB in good conditions. They dived Smugglers Cave which had a shock wave due to the compression of air at the top of the cave. They also dived Wanderers, Drumsticks and Crocodile Head.

Michael Latimer dived his first wreck off Malabar, with Rick and Lyn and Sue (friends of Rick). The vis was around 20-30ft, however his lost his knife during the dive.

Ron and Co dived JB with flat conditions and 80-100ft visibility. They dived a spot where David House lost his torch in 1987, and actually found the very same torch, incredible but it still worked!! (NB. The batteries were "Duracells").

A commendation goes to Brain who finally sold the "Black Death".
