## Member's Dive Reports:

Scott Leimroth & Rebecca Davis travelled to Nth Solitary Is, swam with Dolphins & Whales. They dived Fish Rock Cave at Sth West Rocks, Colorado Pass-a wall dive to 45m, saw Grey Nurse Sharks & Turtles. The Titan Crane at Laurieton, bad vis, strong current. Cod Ground had a seal playing with them & lots of Grey Nurse.

Robyn Hewitt had 4 Reef dives in Noosa. Beautiful diving in & out of Bait Reef lagoon. Also dived at Kurnell, saw large Octopus & Cuttlefish.

Geoff Cook dived in Ballina & Byron Bay, the wreck "The Wollongbar". Allan Jarrett has a lot of great artifacts in his collection, worth a look if in Ballina.

Chris Vautin dived at Eden with Peter Hall, very cold, saw Seals, Whales and Dolphins.

Leo Bergagnin has been diving at Shark Point and Maroubra, as well as playing with a Sea Urchin's anus on his Marine Biology course with Mike Scotland!!

Martin Kandilas told of his father and fishing friends' episode with Humpback Whales, 8 miles out to sea.

#### **General Business:**

Peter Flockart is selling John Reilly's book on "The Myola" for \$15.00 each. Good history research and diagrams.

Scott Leimroth has an Aquacore magazine; US high tech diving, mixed gas diving, safety, deep & wrecks.

Also presented Rick Latimer with a wind-up diver doll, for all his good work and widely known character within the industry.

Geoff Cook promoted The QLD Maritime Museum for great artifacts including telegraphs, helms, bells. Entry allowed into a WWII warship, steamer.

Leo Bergagnin has been provided with promo material by Southern Cross Divers, promoting BSAC (British Based Certification Agency). Leo discussed aspects including insurance, training modules, fees. Leo feels that we should have continuing discussion on the benefits of joining BSAC. Is a club-based agency and contained within the Memo of Association: "all BSAC clubs are entitled to sponsorship". There are 6 BSAC members based in Sydney.

BJ suggests that retailers would take a negative attitude to SPDC membership. Rick Latimer says there are no real benefits for diver instruction. Gordon McDonald thinks it may well be worth looking more into the Insurance benefits.

## Magnetometer Proposal:

Craig Harwood suggested priority be given for safety issues ie First Aid & Oxy equipment. Eddie Labour questions who will look after property. Leo Bergagnin suggests a Property Officer be nominated to log equipment. Leo will house to begin with.

BJ dissaproves. Doesn't see benefits for most Club members. One small group will want for selves. Against hire charges for members. Money could be put to better use. Michael McFadyen questioned if there is a model in mind. Scott Leimroth gave description of model.

Geoff Cook proposed the use for the discovery of "The Nemesis" and other recoverable wrecks. Equipment will locate metal within a stones throw of Divesite. Leo Bergagnin suggests the Club is riding too heavily on AUPY photo comp. There are other areas to pursue including the exploratory side of the Club. We don't have a boat etc, can afford to buy. Geoff Cook said that there is only one unit available for rent which is too expensive and has to come with owner.

Martin Kandilas questioned if a wreck is found, what is the Policy. Leo Bergagnin recommends that we have Club-advertised dives and anyone is welcome to join discovery.

Scott Leimroth suggests Wreck nights, photo dives & slide shows with discussion on findings and will lead to prestige and recognition for the Club. Leo Bergagnin suggests that Club members set the policies. Michael McFadyen suggests time for recording, photographs and Club secrecy time.

Bob says that wrecks are out there rotting away. Members can participate and experience the thrill of locating. David requests Plan of Recovery be designed.

Geoff Cook has lots of wreck information on file. 4 wrecks ready to locate at present.

Suzanne gave a rundown on extensive research already followed up by certain Club members on the project of "The Nemesis".

Leo Bergagnin gave a rundown of Mike Thatcher's find of a 16th century Spanish Galleon. Leo has discussed with Peter Hall of the many wrecks available to discover at Eden. Michael McFadyen recommends the good publicity available, even prior to location.

Rick Latimer suggests that there is not enough research or information at present to make a decision on purchase, no clear objectives, operating procedures should be laid down first. Leo Bergagnin mentions that AUPY competition is always a gamble, this subject of purchase is same. Rick Latimer recommends that the unit must pay for itself. Adrienne says that if it is a White Elephant ... Club can sell.

Craig Harwood recommends if the vote is negative, a proposal can be put forward at a later date. Rick Latimer suggested that proposal should be presented in a better format.

Members proceeded to vote in Secret Ballot style. Michael McFadyen and Eddie Labour controlled the counting.

Conclusion: 35 Total - 3 invalid; 19 For; 13 Against.
