- Michael McFadyen dived the Tuggerah; had 25 metres visibility and a little current; saw 50+ Port Jacksons on the bottom and heaps of numb rays.
- Eddy Labour dived Underwater Wilderness (known as the Gullies), a drift dive with swim throughs; saw heaps of Port Jacksons; visibility was not good. Michael McFadyen mentioned that Rebecca Davies was diving with them in her new drysuit; Rebecca went to the surface early because her foot had come out of the drysuit and her fin came off; her buddies kept going and didn't notice Rebecca's plight. for a while.
- Geoff Cook mentioned that there are approx. 9 Pineapple Fish in a little cave around from Jibbon Point at the moment.
- Peter Flockart dived the Tuggerah; had filthy visibility and it was very cold on the bottom, approx.12°C.
- Paul Howlett dived Shark Point; had approx. 20 metres visibility; plenty of fish.
- Suzanne Evans recently did a drift dive from Fly Point to Fish Co-op at Port Stephens; saw a Blue Shark on the sand.
- Leo Bergagnin mentioned that a group of Club members recently spent a week diving the Solomons on the liveaboard, Spirit of the Solomons; diving was mostly reef and some wrecks; dived the Kenawa, which was a cargo ship, a good dive; lots of dives had swim throughs and caves where you could surface inside.
