Ross Hipwell dived with Martin Atkins at Jervis Bay; dived The Banks and Crocodile Head. John Szwecow also dived at JB with Martin.

Scott Egginton dived Barrons Hut on the SCANS dive day; had approx 10 metres visibility; saw fish and eels.

Michael McFadyen, Daryl Gibbs, Eddie Labour and Adrienne Hill recently travelled to Madang, PNG to dive; water was 29-30 degrees; dived four wrecks, 2 aeroplanes, night dives and drift dives; all together completed approx. 22 dives; also went on sight seeing tours.

Peter Foster mentioned that he has 2 spots left on the trip he is taking in January on the liveaboard, Victory at Jervis Bay; dates are 13-16 Jan; cost is \$250 for first 2 days and \$110/day thereafter. See Peter if interested.

He said that the Yongala is in about 30 metres of water and is covered in growth; also dived at Broadhurst Reef and took lots of photo's; 5 Club members went on the trip and it was arranged through The Dive Bell, Townsville.

Gordon McDonald participated in the Helmet Fetish day at Manly; Leo Bergagnin said that Bob May will show a video of the day at the December Club meeting.

Louise Ramson from Scotland talked about diving off the west coast of Scotland at an Archipelago of Islands known as St. Kilda. You can do a 10 day liveaboard trip on a three masted sailing ship to the area; water temperature is about 9 degrees; there are lots of drop offs and 100+ species of nudibranchs.

Bob May mentioned that 6 Club members went on the recent Helmet Fetish day at Manly. Bob said that..."you are not really a diver until you have dived in hard hats".
