Dive Reports

Jason Farlow. I have been doing lots of rockhops around Sydney. Went South with club members and dived in JB, Bowen Island with Nick and both Nick and he dived on the Club Dive out of Wollongong Harbour with United Divers.

Mitchell Cook organised the Club Dive at Wollongong. Water was cold and dark and very strong southerly current down the coast at the moment. Apparently greater than 3 knots out wide and a bit less in close.

Scott Willan. Went to dive the wreck of the S S Bega with Max and Andreas but there was heaps of current on the site and it was undiveable. Surging between 1½ and 2½ knots over the wreck. As an alternative we ran up to the wrecksite of the S S Mimosa which was closer into shore in 17 metres of water. We has general marks of the site and Andreas went north from the anchor and I headed south. Andreas saw nothing... whoops.... I swam about 25 metres and found lots of boilers, a donkey boiler and winches. There were about 2 dozen good size crayfish in and around the boilers. On the second day we dived the wreck of the S S Lady Darling in 30 metres of water and south of Montague Island. Two dives both good.. Amazed that the stern port lamp is still on the wreck. On the weekend before had a Friday Saturday and Sunday diving the Catterthun up at Seal Rocks. Huge winds made the trip down a shocker. Did 2 dives on the first two days with decent 12 -15 metre viz. First dive anchored up near the bow and 2nd day anchored in the middle and dived the stern. Max took some video but the perfect film day still eludes him.

Andy Del. Attempted to dive the S S Bega on the same weekend as Scott but on Eggers boat. The current was horrid and a joke. We pulled up stumps and dived the Tasman Hauler out of Eden instead. Also dived on Bazza's Vomit Rocket diving the barge. Rough seas in the previous 6 weeks so no other diving.

Jason Scotwelsh. I have dived Wollongong Harbour with Leeroy. Saw the first pods of whales for the season at JB and also saw whaler sharks on those dives.

El Pres... A hopeless broken down armchair diver... how sad... booked in for spinal surgery on the 2^{nd} of July and will be out of the water for an extended period of time. Dive Gear has been hidden in the garage to remove the temptation.
