- O Club Member and Diver, David Nathan BECK, was tragically drowned in a snorkelling accident whilst holidaying in Vanuatu on the 5 October 2010 with his wife Cristi.. Circumstances were that he and a number of others were caught in a surging rip current. Several of them were rescued and taken back to the beach. Returning to rescue David at which time he had drowned. He was worked on on the beach but was unable to be revived. A moving ceremony was held on the island by the tribal locals where flowers were set free into the sea. This process was continued here in Australia at Bare Island on Saturday the 16th October where a commemoration of David's Life was conducted. His ashes will be divided and half with return to the United States and the other will be interred into the artificial reef that is being constructed in Botany Bay.
- David previously served in the United State Marine Corps and had two sons from his first marriage, Justin aged 21 and Joshua aged 19 who are both serving in the US Marines. David was a cancer survivor and a good friend of several members of the club. He will be missed.

Diving Activity.

Local Diving for the past month has been a challenge with a succession of weekends of big seas, gale force winds and finally filthy water with 1 metres viz,

The club dive for the 10 October was cancelled because of the ugly water viz and uneasy seas. But will be rescheduled on the weekend of the 14th November .. Jason Farlow will lead.

Peter and Joan have been away over to Tonga doing 10 dives and a further 4 snorkel dives with the humpback whales. 150 ft viz and much better than they ever imagined. Max depth of 30 metres. Very much like diving Palau. Accomodation was ordinary but clean. Noel suggested a dive on the wreck there was a must aving dived it in 2003 the wreck of a coconut trader. Viz in channel was 40 -50 feet. Cost of trip was \$2800 per person.for 10 days. Lobsters were \$45 Tongan or \$30au.

Jason did a few dives at Nelson Bay. Halifax Point and Fly Point. Looking into a trip up that way with the launch of a 70ft dive boat operation..

Peter Jaques and Ian Jackson on the 10^{th} didn't listen to the reports that the dive had been cancelled because the water was crap.. and dived at Shell Harbour..... and the water was crap 1 metre viz, but he had a dive..

Andreas Thimm had just returned from diving in the South China Sea with Bazza on Vidars boat. Dives on the English WW2 battleships Princes of Wales and the Repulse. 70metre dives with 15 metre viz 45 minute bottom times on the wrecks... all his deco this year was on the rebreather and not on pure O2 and no symptoms affecting his eyesight.

Reports received from Andy Del who had just returned from CCR diving on a trip organised by Lance Robb over in Chuuk with awesome dives, extended bottom times good viz and good accommodation at Blue Lagoon. Report and photos to follow soon.
