PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Again new large caves were found aplenty over the last year. All these new features have had to be recorded.

For the Nullarbor, Peter Ackroyd and partner Jenny Smith have converted the table-driven ACCESS database into a forms-driven ACCESS database. Jenny has also added help and other aids in using the data. After experience with use of this database it will be expanded to include other caving regions.

For those of us that thought "CEGSA Library and Records" was a synonym of George MacLucas, we can now see that they are separate entities. After 13 years as Librarian and 12 years as Records Officer, George has handed over the task to someone else. During his tenure he did a magnificent job of dealing with the numerous requests from government, universities, other libraries and individuals for reference material. Not being happy to just absorb the steady stream of data emanating from our members he was constantly finding his own supply from hundreds of magazines that we would not consider looking at but contain an odd item on caves or caving.

An interesting request came to CEGSA from the Blinman Progress Association to conduct some surveying in the Blinman Mine. Headed up by Gary Woodcock, a determination was made on the thickness of the floor beneath a proposed tourist access tunnel.

Swansea Caving Club (UK) visited the Nullarbor during the year to investigate the use of microgravity in detecting caves. CEGSA assisted in logistics, site selection, navigation, personnel and discussions on geological history.

The major new cave near Naracoorte - Elderslie Cave – was explored and mapped with a view to aid its preservation. Even if wantonly destroyed, we now have some record of its existence and beauty.

SECRETARY REPORT

The committee was occupied with a range of pursuits during 2004, some of which have been rewarding, and some simply frustrating. The ongoing issue of falling general meeting attendance was discussed on many occasions. We decided that all meetings would have a generally “social” emphasis to them, rather than business. This in itself is unlikely to result in people flocking back to meetings, and so plans were started for a phone-survey of members to find out what would entice them back. The survey has not been completed yet, but it is certain that some vitality and interest currently lacking will be needed to bolster meeting numbers (and membership). The state of the CEGSA website has been a pestering aggravation for the committee. After a year of pushing to get it updated, it is not even available for viewing at all. In 2005 this is really an embarrassment for us – we are a ‘peak body’ of national significance – with a defunct website.

The revision of the leader status system has been an important activity driven by the committee, but this too has been somewhat frustrating because merely raising the subject again has caused some members to be “put off” by the whole business, and probably stay away from meetings. We are still going caving. Will trying to find a practical fix to the intermingled leadership/insurance issue eventually drive us to just stop being members of a club and do our own thing in our own groups? There has been some good discussion among those interested, and Mark Sefton has worked hard on coming up with an updated system – still acknowledging the ASF standards, but hopefully giving more flexibility to CEGSA members who just want to run trips, without feeling like they need a Diploma to do so. While we obviously have legal responsibilities, a sense of strong regulation will squeeze the life out of our Group.

More positive progress was that the records and library were finally moved out of the MacLucas’ home, to several locations and most predominantly Graham Pilkington’s home in November. No doubt George and June are relieved to have their space back. We gratefully appreciate their many years of help.

A number of applications for funding grants from the Office of Volunteers were unfortunately not successful. The committee thanks Marie for her dedicated efforts working on these.

The committee agreed to support Peter Horne in publishing his updated “Lower South East Cave Reference Book” – by handling the accounting for sales. Thanks go to Graham and Chris Gibbons for helping with this. CEGSA is a patron of this new edition.

A number of outside requests for help from CEGSA came in through the committee again in 2004. The Yellow Footed Rock Wallaby Preservation Association asked for help in developing a management plan for Eyrie Cave in the Flinders Ranges, and the Blinman Progress Association requested help in surveying part of the Blinman Mine tourist project. Naracoorte Caves National Park also asked for digitised copies of Park cave maps held by CEGSA. I think these types of projects and assistance are really important and help strengthen our standing as an important organisation contributing to our State.

I hope that our 50th anniversary committee can innovate, clear the way for things to happen, and importantly proactively lead CEGSA to inspire some new young members interested in cave exploration into action.

CAVING ACTIVITIES



ADELAIDE HILLS & FLEURIEU PENINSULA

The principal focus in this region has yet again been on Sellicks Hill, with work progressing in both 5A5 and 5A25. Several significant breakthroughs have been achieved in 5A5, still progressing down a rift. The cave appears to be becoming more heavily decorated as it goes deeper. Overall, however, the gains remain modest in terms of what we eventually hope to achieve. There is yet another hole in the floor to be cleared of rock at the deepest point, with very little room to stack it.

Digging in 5A25 continues, with less spectacular results at this stage, although recently encountered airflows are encouraging and spur us on.

A couple of visits were made to the Delamere region. Much work went in to removing the remains of a long lost cow from our deepest dig, and several other promising features were revisited. Lack of time and manpower are the main reasons that progress in all these areas is so slow. The potential is certainly there even if it is not widely recognised as such.

The Reynella Quarry Cave situation is still not fully resolved although we are still optimistic that the future of the cave will be eventually ensured under a more general management plan for the proposed park along the Field River valley.

Surveying of the cave has not progressed in the last 12 months. We are still hopeful that we will eventually gain access to the results of the ground penetrating radar survey carried out last year as part of an environmental impact assessment process required by the Council of the developers of adjacent land. We have been promised that the data would be made available once the Council has fully assessed the reports and the development approval process has run its course. This is a time consuming process for all parties involved and we are learning to be patient

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EYRE PENINSULA

No caving trips reported, but a records keeper did travel the Flinders Highway between Ceduna and Port Lincoln (twice) stopping at a few roadside caves. Coastal cliffs on much of the west side of the peninsula are the potential site of sea caves. What is needed is intrepid cave explorers.

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FLINDERS RANGES

A few trips to the Flinders Ranges were run, still mainly in the Narrina / Wirrealpa area where the Wilkawillina limestone is conducive to discovering many Karst features.

New features were located and recorded during the Easter trip but on the October trip a significant find in F200 of a water resurgence and flow has given indications of a positive lead for further extensions.

The survey of a section of the old Blinman Copper Mine was another interesting project, undertaken at the request of the Blinman Progress Association. This was to aid their extension of the tourist inspection of the mine.

There are still several located features that remain unexplored to date leaving plenty of scope for trips in the future.

Early October rain added an unexpected attractiveness to the region.

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LOWER SOUTH EAST

Caves numbered 14

New caves are still being found. Some of these result from following up old reports and others are new reports. Most of the activity has been in the area to the south west of Mount Gambier. Four of the new caves have been mapped. Adam has an interest in cave mapping and is progressively developing mapping skills, so we hope to see a flourish of new maps.

Chris Grant is continuing his study of the wintering sites of the bent wing bat and regularly visits key sites. The caves of the area have historically been used to dispose of rubbish and recently a diver found sticks of explosive in L101. He was unsure of his location so the SA Police sought our assistance in locating the cave.

The Catchment Management Plans covering the area have targeted research into water dependant karst ecosystems. A database is being prepared to record this information so the data is available in a format that will be meaningful. It is hoped to apply for a grant in the future to assist with the development of this database.

Recording of locations with GPS continues as does the recording of newspaper articles relating to caves. Fred has spent numerous hours in the State Library chasing up old reports. The CEGSA computers located in the South East have helped with the maintenance of the records, but it still takes time to catch up with the field work.

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NULLARBOR PLAIN

N numbers are now at 3050 up from last year's 2708. Most work here was done by Ray Gibbons and Peter Ackroyd, but Graham Pilkington also made significant contributions.

Ken Boland led his 5th expedition. This time, from his ultra light aircraft, he located 604 features, with the total for the 5 trips being 1753. No words of mine can adequately convey the immense value of this addition to caving knowledge.

Another revision of the caving database has occurred. Peter Ackroyd and partner Jenny Smith spent more than a year on the task. The db now integrates maps and entrance photos. They also rationalised (yes I think that is the right term) the structure of many tables and the linking mechanisms. The author ID is now "easy" to use. Since "Author" information crops up in most tables, this simplification was necessary. This work follows a previous significant revision of the db by Paul Devine. Paul dabbled in many areas of the db including mineral types, and the plethora of coordinate systems for giving cave locations (a result of people using GPS machines). These behind the scenes contributions are essential for the continued smooth operation of the database.

Stop Press:

"if one were to walk far enough in a straight line on the Nullarbor one would find a new cave" This was said by Elery Hamilton-Smith to Tom Draper on the Jan 1957 ASF post conference trip. The result was that Tom went walking and found N10 Toms Hole. (Thanks to Elery and Peter Ackroyd for this gem).

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UPPER SOUTH EAST

Caves numbered 23

This area has had a resurgence of activity and this is reflected in the number of new caves and features found in the last twelve months.

A new cave in a quarry attracted a lot of interest as it was in danger of being lost. It is a significant cave both in size and content. A survey has been done and Steve Bourne has been negotiating with the Council to protect the cave. Several smaller caves in the quarry were also mapped. The area in the vicinity of U69 was looked at and several new caves recorded.

Avenue Range has been the trend setter this year. Despite being despised by most members this area has resulted in most of the new caves. Two trips were run and we are still catching up with the field work. A couple of dozen new caves will eventually enter the system. These vary from large Monbulla type systems to more sedate smaller caves.

Ian Lewis is doing work for his masters in the Naracoorte area. As part of this a levelling trip was run and some 36 caves and numerous other reference marks were levelled and located to within 5mm accuracy, in a day.

Other areas to receive attention were Morambro Creek, Hynam and Francis. Various caves, dolines and runaway holes have been noted or documented.

A day trip was also held at Growling Swallett in the Junee Florentine. The Second half of the trip was held in mole creek with other members visiting well known caves in the area including Croesus, Lynds, Marakooa and Genghis.

The Survey that was commenced in January at Chain of ponds cave in Hastings was completed in December by interstate member Damian Grindley and other interstate cavers.

Early 2004 on 28/3/04 June and George MacLucas attended a full day trip with an Adventure Tour Group at Katoomba in the Blue Mounatins. The trip included their son and his partner in an abseiling technique refresher course resulting in a canyoning excursion finishing at the bottom of Empress Falls.

At Easter several interstate cavers joined a CEGSA trip at Naracoorte surveying a number of caves off park.

In May Grant Gartrell attended an ACKMA AGM in Mole Creek, and in conjunction with that participated in visits to tourist caves of the district to inspect various aspects of cave lighting, as well as a more exhilarating wet wade into Croesus, to gain experience removing leeches from his eyelids. A most enjoyable, successful and educational experience.

In September Interstate member Damian Grindley attended a SUSS trip. During the Imperial Cave Dive trip to push Far Country, the support team made investigations in a northern rock pile and discovered a route through into new passage. The new passage is believed to be associated with the development of stream way at the level of Alladin Cave.

Damian also went on cave mapping trip to Colong cave in NSW.

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INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

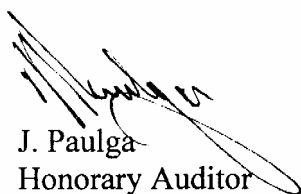
To the President and Members of the Cave Exploration Group (South Australia) Incorporated.

**Income and Expenditure Statement and Balance Sheet for the period
1 January 2004 to 31 December 2004**

I have audited the Income and Expenditure Statement and the Balance Sheet for 2004. In my opinion the Statement fairly presents the financial transactions of the Group for the period 1st January 2004 to 31st December 2004 and the Balance Sheet fairly presents the financial position of the Group at 31st December 2004.

Scope and Procedures

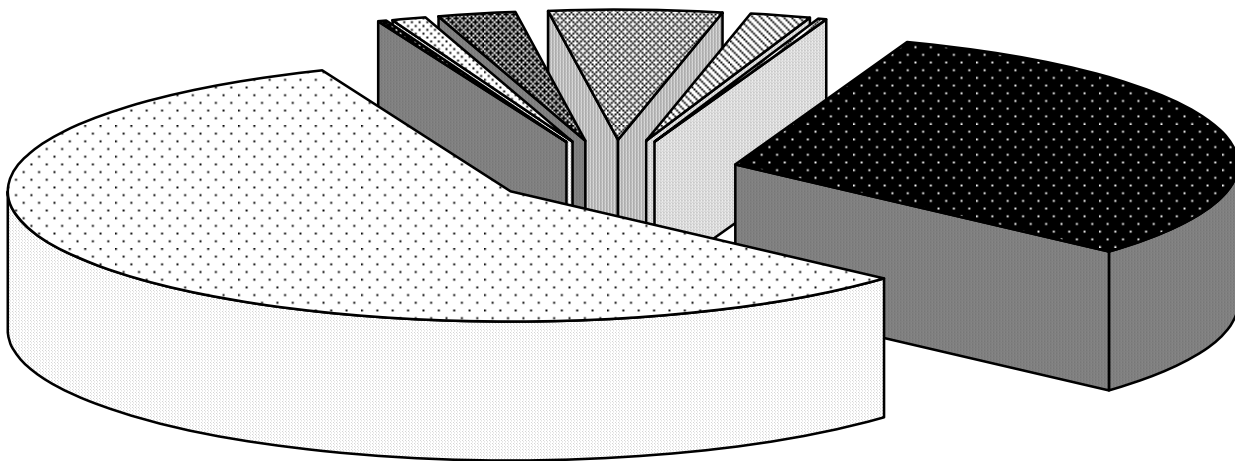

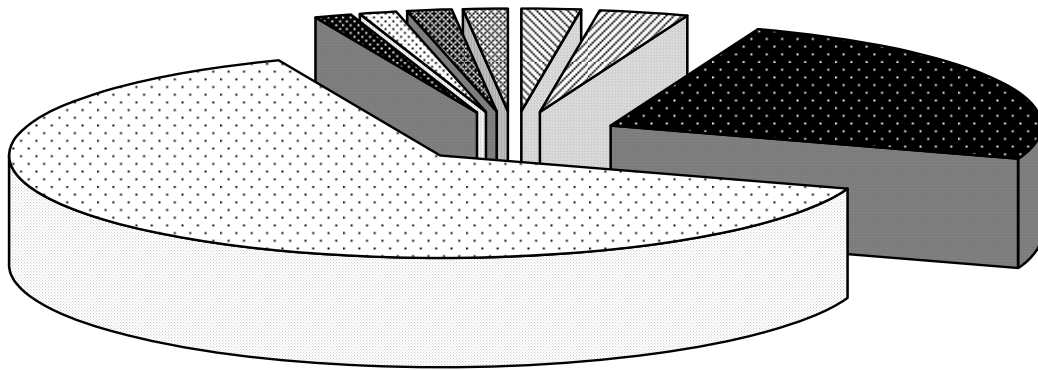

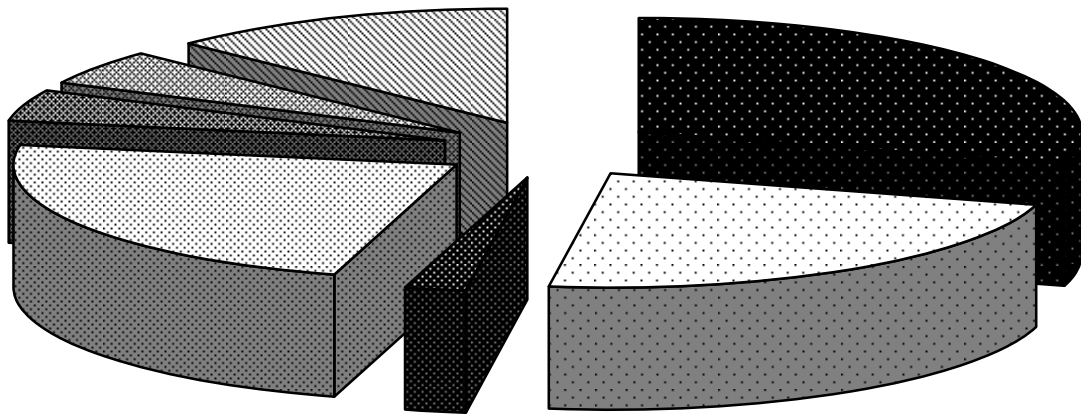
