Swan who spoke on insects, particularly those likely to be encountered on caving trips, and including the bugs causing the "Robe Itch", found along part of the Coorong and near Robe. Mr. R. Sexton who spoke on maps and their preparation.
- TRIPS:- Two trips have been held so far this quarter. The first and most notable splashed and slid its way to the Flinders Ranges where the wild flowers, scenery and mud were all in excellent condition. The famous call "The caves just over that hill" was heard again and useful work was done in ORAPARINNA and LAKE Caves. Arrival in Adelaide was timed by OMEGA at 5.30 am Tuesday.

The second trip was to TANTANOOLA for a caving and social weekend, the evening being organised by the local "Club". A good trip was had by all participating. Only limited caving was done apart from the mapping of the first chamber of the LAKE Cave - 1,000 ft. of circular traverse. The lake was plumbed and found to be 35 ft. deep. The ceiling is still undetermined, due to the lack of stalactite proof balloons.

The two major trips of the programme are still to come. They are the XMAS trips to TASMANIA and Lake HAMILTON. We will be represented at the conference by D. LANYON. 4 or 5 others will be attending the conference and trips to follow.
