"To the Editor of the Newsletter, Cave Exploration Group of S.A.

I am somewhat offended - not personally - by the editorial which appeared in the recent Newsletter of the Group, and feel that I should voice my dissatisfaction for what it is worth.

The tone of your editorial suggests that "workers" are those who go on trips, that "workers" are not "thinkers"; and that they become "thinkers" by the mere process of time - of advancing senility, if you like.

It appears to me that the fellow who does an efficient job of keeping equipment up to scratch, or maintaining a records system, is just as much a "worker" as the keenest attendee of trips. Likewise, I have been on trips with some very keen bods who attend every possible trip, but whose greatest service to caving would be their complete retirement. It also, following from this, strikes me that to be any use at all, a "worker" is also a "thinker". Most cavers are. However, if they are not thinkers while caving, they are even less likely to be so afterwards.

Apart from the question of logic in all this, there is a much more important practical issue. The trog who no longer takes an active part in caving but stays on "in an advisory capacity" becomes all too easily, an old maid. It becomes all too easy to advise on why things should not be done, or why they should be done in the way they were in the past.

In other words, let's not give any added weight to the words of those people who just happen to be older in caving years. If they are also older in real knowledge, in their ability to help solve problems, and in their ability to accept new ideas, then we will listen to them anyway, and no apologia such as your editorial is necessary.

Sorry to be revolutionary. Can I close on one other note - that I respect the value of such an editorial, even though I disagree with it, and I would like to uphold the right of the editor to speak out, even if people do disagree or even if everybody disagrees.
