Since our last circular we have, unfortunately, only been able to hold one trip. On the 15, 16, 17th of this month a party visited Kubla Khan Cave at Mole Creek. Early on Sunday morning fluorescein was put into the creek going underground just in front of How's Cave - this creek does not flow through How's Cave. By Monday there was still no trace of fluorescein in the underground river in Kubla Khan. According to local reports this could not be possible as sawdust, put into the surface creek, showed up some time later in Sassafras Creek. Unfortunately it is impossible to follow this creek underground as the water seems to disappear down some very small cracks. Here is an excellent chance for someone to practice himself in the use of explosives.

A survey was made of the entrance and main chamber of Kubla Khan and several altimeter readings were taken at important points outside the cave. These showed that the underground river in Kubla Khan is about two hundred feet below the valley bottom. Very soon we hope to go back to this interesting cave and continue our scientific investigations.

Using two rubber dinghies, members explored the downstream section of the underground river in Kubla Khan. They found white fish, an enormous river chamber, and some fabulous formation. This new discovery received considerable publicity in the press and over the air and has aroused a lot of interest in caving. The party also found an interesting new passage in Howe's Cave with some good forma-Two new caves were explored by the Club and were christened Elsie's Cave and Wombat Cave respectively. Elsie's Cave yielded an interesting collection of fossil bones, while Wombat Cave brought the party face to face with a life wombat. Two members spent more than three weeks in the West Coast area. No caves were found near the Jane River, but some promising potholes were discovered in Bubb's Hill. The deepest one is an estimated 150 ft. vertical drop followed by a steep slope of unknown length. The limestone area was found to be more extensive than had been thought and is close to the Lyell Highway.

Two other members spent a few days in Gunn's Plains but reported no new discoveries.

Club membership is increasing and several prospective members are on the list.

Unfortunately, no cave discoveries of great importance have been made since the last circular.

At Ida Bay, a small party found a few minor caves near the present limestone quarry. One of these caves was found near the top of the quarry and will at some later stage be destroyed as the quarry face recedes further up the hill. This cave was packed with small formations, including some very interesting examples of the Botryoidal type.

One member of the party descended the pothole found in the dolina behind the rail-terminus. This pot was blocked with mud about 50 feet below the entrance and seemed to connect with the other pothole — about ten feet away from the entrance — discovered earlier by members of the Club.

At Mole Creek, the combined party - Launceston Walking Club and T.C.C. - found another way of reaching the new chamber in Kubla Khan. This involves a great deal of rock climbing, leaving only one stretch where the use of a boat is necessary.

Apparently this new route is relatively easy and saves a lot of time, specially when a big party is involved.

During the March Long Week End a party descended some of the Bubb Hill potholes. Unfortunately, these pots proved to be no exception to the general rule "Nine out of the ten don't go." However, we still have two river caves to explore in this area plus a few more "possibles".

More Cave Stamps: Two new 10 yen Japanese stamps depict formations of the Akiyoshi area. The stamps are multicoloured. One shows the great column called Ohgonbashire (Golden Pillar) of Akiyoshi Cave and the other is a view of Karrenfelder (Karenfuyerudo in Japanese) on the surface of the Akiyoshi Helps the tourist trade without a doubt.

Atomic Project "Gnome" in New Mexico: Much interest has been aroused by the proposed detonation of a nuclear device at a depth of 1200 ft. beneath the salt flats 25 miles south east of Carlsbad. The effect of the explosion at the Carlsbad Caverns 25 miles away is not expected to be perceptible, though equivalent to 10,000 tons of TNT. An earthquake in 1932 in West Texas was felt by cavern visitors, but no damage was caused.



SEARCH AND RESCUE:

The recent misadventure at Exit Cave, although not serious in as much as no danger actually existed for anyone, was serious in as much as an emergency did arise and the Club moved swiftly to take all necessary steps to effect a search and rescue. The Club in this instance was inconvenienced by lack of information from the party (none of whom are financial members). This, and the possibility of other occurrences in the future, together with the desire to have closer cooperation with the Police search and rescue organisation, has led to a revision of the Club's policy in such circumstances. Club members involved in the reorganised scheme will be notified of what position they are to play if any future occasion arises.

TASMANIAN CAVERNEERING CLUB

CAVE SEARCH AND RESCUE ORGANISATION

The Tasmanian Caverneering Club, founded in 1946, established its own Cave Search and Rescue Organisation early in 1959 which affiliated with the Police Department in August of that year.

This Organisation is on call on a continuous basis. It comes into action whenever the Police Department or other authorities report a party overdue in caves or limestone areas known to contain caves.

The Organisation is staffed by the Club's members and necessarily depends upon the co-operation of the Police Department and other persons. The Club, over a period of years, has collected extensive information including maps of many caves and limestone areas, it has the equipment necessary for the safe exploration of caves, and its members are fully trained in underground work.

DRILL FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE

As soon as any Police Officer receives a report to the effect that a party is lost or injured in a cave or limestone area he is to contact Police H.Q, in Hobart without delay and pass on information on:-

- 1. Which cave,
- 2. How many in party,
- 3. How long in cave or overdue,
- 4. Is party lost or injured or trapped,
- 5. What equipment, food, lights, clothes, etc. were in party,
- 6. If injured and/or trapped, how for in cave,
- 7. Weather conditions for past week.
- 1. H.Q. to instruct Officer reporting to stand by; then pass on alert and information to Police Officer in Charge of Rescue. He will then contact one of the four persons following who will then come to H.Q. and act as Controller for the Club. (See list at end.)
- 2. If information indicates that a doctor is required immediately, then Dr. R.J. Chapman should be contacted (See list at end), given the necessary information, told to pack personal caving gear and to report to H.Q. as soon as possible within 30 minutes.
- 3. P.O. then to contact the next six people on list. If they have own transport they are to proceed to their own homes to collect caving gear. If they live en route they are to remain for Car I to collect them. If they have no transport then patrol car to pick them up, take them home to collect their gear and take them to H.Q. for Car I to collect.
- 4. The driver of Car I, being the first to be contacted as he is the O.I.C., will report to H.Q. to pick up personnel and gear, receive information on whereabouts of others, pick them up, proceed to area.
- 5. H.Q. then contacts next six persons on list, follow previous routine, these will constitute Car II. Car II is to collect all remaining Club equipment, food, telephone gear and wire, camping equipment, and any other equipment they require to establish a base camp and clearing station anywhere in the Island.
- 6. When ready Car II proceeds to area and reports to O.I.C. for further details.
- 7 H.Q. alerts the next three to four persons on list and have them on permanent standby ready to leave at 30 minutes notice.

- 8. The Club Controller will remain at H.Q. and assist by relaying requests from O.I.C. to necessary authorities and act as general Liaison man.
- 9. The Police Officer in the area giving the initial alert is to stand by at base camp if so required to assist with organisation/communications.

IF PERSON/PARTY LOST IN AREA - CAVE UNKNOWN

- 1. Preparations as before no change.
- 2. Outside help may be required large numbers of men to search area and caves. Each small unit will be in charge of a T.C.C. member who knows area and caves. O.I.C. and assistants will remain at temporary base camp e.g. Police Officer if close to area. When contact established they move out and establish base camp on the spot. Unskilled helpers no longer required to be dismissed to avoid confusion.

PUBLICITY

The ONLY persons allowed to make press releases are:Police H.Q., Controller, O.I.C. or his deputy.

REQUESTS FOR NON-TCC EQUIPMENT

The ONLY persons allowed to request special equipment are:Police H.Q., Controller, O.I.C. or his deputy.

MEDICAL AID

If Club M.O. not immediately available, Police H.Q. to arrange for other suitable M.O, to take his place. In that instance he should be advised that central kit is ready, the nature of injuries likely to be encountered.

FIELD ORGANISATION

In control of all rescue work is the TCC Officer in Charge (O.I.C.). He will remain at base camp and organise rescue operations. He will need two assistants to take care of communications - at least one to be TCC. They will also take care of camp and meals, etc.

The O.I.C. is to remain in contact with the Controller at H.Q. so that up to date reports will go through and requests for special aid can be passed on without delay. To this effect the co-operation of P.M.G. is needed.

A trained TCC Party Leader will <u>direct</u> actual rescue work underground. Rescue work will be carried out in shifts - two parties of six men each working up to six hours depending on nature of work. As one party works, the other party rests at camp base. If cave is large and rescue work in a long distance, more parties may be needed or advance base camp established underground. The 0.I.C. and Party Leader will decide on this when they get there.

EQUIPMENT

Car I is to take the following:-

.3.

Medical Kit - to be drawn up by Dr. Chapman. 2 - 100' 1¼" nylon ropes. 60' cable ladder. Axe, pinch bar, Army trenching tool. Emergency rations. Communications equipment.

Car II takes:-

Camping gear required for base camp, ie. large marquee, smaller tents, cooking utensils, primus stoves, etc.

Rescue stretcher - Neill Robertson type.

All remaining TCC equipment.

Food - quantity depending on type of work.

Extra ropes - new hemp.

TCC maps of area and its caves.

Following gear may be needed later:-

Extra medical supplies.

Radio equipment.

Power saws, power pumps, explosives, drills, experts to handle.

Mobile generators and extra lights, oxygen, masks, hoses, air compressors, etc.

It is suggested that a crash box of all essential equipment be stored at Police H.Q. for instant use. Much of the above equipment could then be left there, thus saving time collecting it from other places.

TRIP REPORT

Maydena - 4-5th August. This time as Albert Goede was leading we found the cave entrance which he had discovered last summer. The other cave entrance found on the last trip to this area is 200 yards away and apparently a different system. The new hole is a gigantic rift nearly 200 feet deep with a creek flowing in. Having used the available ladders, the party was halted

at a 20 feet pitch not far beyond the threshold but still about 200 feet below the surface. Another trip is organised for 18-19th August and with an additional 60 feet of ladder should reveal more of the cave's secrets. The water temperature of the creek was taken at 36 deg. F. [2.2°C] and it felt warm to our frozen hands. We also made the acquaintance of a marsupial mouse which welcomed the unexpected supply of tit-bits.

TRIP REPORT

Maydena 18-19th August. A Party of four spent the weekend up at the Rift Cave which had been explored down to 200 feet on the last trip. This time a depth of 430 feet was

achieved by abseiling a pitch and then walking down steeply inclined talus. At this depth there are two possible continuations — a crawl which needs digging out and a smooth chimney. It was discovered from the Club archives that this cave had been explored to this point in 1947, however, it is felt that on the next trip, a new cave will be entered. During the weekend the party also looked at several holes in the gully about 200 yards east of the Rift Cave. The deepest went to 120 feet almost vertically but all were choked with rubbish.

EDITORIAL

DEATH AT BUNGONIA

Elsewhere in this issue is a report of the inquiry Highland Caving Group held into the death of one of their members John Bryant at Bungonia on 22nd May 1965. This inquiry delved into the facts available in an effort to determine the prime cause culminating in the death of this member, however two facts emerge which must arouse every thinking caver to wonder just how well equipped we are as individuals to ensure our own safety and to contribute to the safety of others.

The first of these facts is concerned with how and why the fall took place. Considerations such as fainting fits, foul air, over-fatigue are almost irrelevant when we learn that this man was secured by a safety rope. This rope was of adequate strength and, we believe quite ably handled by the man on belay and yet on one of the rare occasions when the safety line is required to hold a man and save his life it fails - and why? It failed because the knot tied by the member round himself was inadequate considering the type of rope used. The rope was a "Silver" rope made of polythene. It is very slippery and would require special knots to secure it. The manufacturer's specification states that a bowline is a suitable knot, however very minor experiments with the rope show how easily this knot slips undone and it is even more serious still when we conclude that Bryant's death may be directly attributable to this fact. In previous years S.S.S. has always stressed the need of what might be called "rope safety" and this embraces:-

- 1. Thorough knowledge of knots.
- 2. When and how to use them and in the case of synthetic ropes when not to use them.
- 3. Care of ropes and methods of inspection.
- 4. The more specialised knowledge required if synthetic ropes are used.

As a result of this accident it is our intention to carry out tests on various types of rope in the next few months to determine types of rope most suitable for caving, and the results of these tests will be made known when completed. Furthermore S.S.S. field days and trip leaders training courses both include the above rope safety points as part of our general training, and every caver in the interests of his own safety should learn all he can about how to preserve himself. These weekends of which more are planned, provide us with an opportunity to refresh our memories and keep up with the latest rope techniques.

The second important fact emerging from the H.C.C. inquiry relates to medical care for injured cavers. It appears that in the case of the Bungonia accident none of the four Goulburn doctors were prepared even to attend the site, let alone descend Drum Cave to provide medical attention on the spot. It is not possible to say whether a doctor could have saved Bryant's life if he had come at the time of the accident, but it is clear that medical help is difficult or impossible to obtain immediately.

Further in cases of accident or serious injury, immediate death may result if victim is moved from the site of the accident by untrained and medically inexperienced people, and thus we are faced with a two-fold problem. The victim of an accident must not be moved and yet we cannot get medical help when most desperately needed.

Therefore, until a society doctor can be located and brought to the scene, or a local doctor is induced to attend we must provide First Aid ourselves. The limited aid provided by the other trip members in the case of the Bungonia accident prolonged the victim's life by some considerable time - estimated to have been as much as one hour, and the importance of providing this initial life preserving help cannot be over-stressed.

Last year S.S.S. members attended first aid classes run by the St. Johns Ambulance and suitable dates are currently being considered for similar classes again this year. In addition we are investigating the possibility of arranging the special course of instruction relating to mine disasters. However we believe this requires a large attendance (40-50) of members who already hold their first aid certificates, to justify the special arrangements required for the course. A letter has, however, been sent to St. Johns Ambulance requesting details, and later issues of Stop Press will advise the outcome.

In the meantime if there is anything to be learned from John Bryant's death at Bungonia it is that every Speleologist's duty, firstly to himself and secondly to his fellow members, is familiarity with knots and rope care and working knowledge of first aid and later possibly the more specialised knowledge relating to mine rescue.

CAVE DEATH AT BUNGONA, N.S.W.

At Bungonia Cave Reserve situated about 18 miles from Goulburn, John Lawrence Bryant of the Highland Caving Group died from injuries received when he fell about 50 ft whilst ascending the 140 ft. pitch out of the Drum Cave on Saturday 22nd May, 1965. Whilst a coroner's inquest will be held into this death, the Highland Caving Group decided to hold a club enquiry and requested attendance from other Sydney Societies. Below is a report of this meeting and some observations therefrom.

Alf Crawley, Martin Foster and Ben Nurse of S.S.S. attended the meeting held on Sunday 31st May, 1965. Standing orders of the Highland Caving Group were suspended to allow discussion of the various aspects of the death of their member John Bryant. The report of the death is largely as follows; Seven members of the H.C.G. descended the Drum with Eric Kaye belaying from the top: The ladder used was aluminium rung and wire light weight ladder and the safety line consisted of a new 14" circumference polythene rope which passed over a log above the Drum drop. All the members of the party descended without mishap. After some time exploring Bryant requested to be allowed to ascend so as to help Kaye belay the rest of the party from the bottom: Bryant started to ascend the drop at about 11.0 a.m. About 50 ft from the bottom, Bryant fell. Bryant suffered serious injury, probably two fractured legs, probably fractured ribs, and injuries to the head and was unconscious. Kaye learning of the extent of the injuries contacted the police via the phone at the second homestead from the reserve and requested a Doctor and an ambulance. The police arrived about 1½ hours later, one of the

Policemen being a member of the Police Cliff Rescue Squad. An ambulance arrived two hours later but no Doctor. Apparently Bryant died about 2½ hours after the fall.

Certain questions were asked of the various members of the trip, and the rope and the boots of Bryant were made available for examination. As a result certain conclusions followed:-

- (1) Bryant was an experienced caver.
- (2) Bryant was conversant with the tieing of a bowline knot.
- (3) Bryant tied a bowline and a half hitch on the descent.
- (4) Bryant probably tied a bowline but not a half hitch on the ascent.
- (5) Bryant's tricounies were fixed to a horseshoe. These horseshoes were larger than the leather heel of the boot and could catch on the ladder rungs. One set on one boot was loose. These horseshoes caused some concern and inconvenience to Bryant as he had complained about these. The horseshoes were not a recent addition to the boots.
- (6) Bryant was not subject to fainting fits, nor was he visibly affected nor had he complained about foul air.
- (7) At the time he fell he seemed to have been climbing steadily and when he fell a load of approximately 100 lbs. was felt by Kaye on the rope before the rope became slack.
- (8) Bryant seemed to have called out before hitting the ground, so ruling out a fainting fit.
- (9) The rope examined immediately after the fall showed a single knot near its end.
- (10) The knot on the rope seems to be the one that remains after a bowline has slipped.

From these facts the following could be deduced:-

- (a) Bryant had probably slipped or was hit by a falling rock and consequently left the ladder.
- (b) The knot in the safety line did not hold.

The reason why the knot did not hold is subjected to some conjecture and it is important first to consider that a bowline had been tied. The rope used was a polythene rope and is probably more slippery than a nylon rope. In caving and rock climbing there have been experiences of bowlines slipping or working loose on nylon rope and it could be assumed that the bowline is more likely to slip on polythene than nylon and certainly more likely than manilla or any other natural fibre ropes.

It was suggested that experiments be carried out on bowlines slipping on polythene ropes and that advice be sought from over-seas groups regarding their experience with this rope.
