CAVE CONVICT 1980 INFORMATION

The beautiful city of Melbourne, situated at the head of Port Phillip Bay at the mouth of the impressive Yarra River, has been chosen as the site for the thirteenth A.S.M. Conference.

Commencing on Saturday 27th December and continuing to Wednesday 31st, the conference will be conducted at the Pharmacy College, Parkville. The accommodation is at International House and Spelcosports will be held at Princes Park, all venues being within close walking distance of each other. Living-in at the conference should be considered a vital part of the conference as it means meeting other cavers in an informal atmosphere, and freely participating in the various night-time social activities.

The photographic competition will be conducted along similar lines to preceding conferences, and the photos or slides will be limited to those taken since MACCON. Start preparing your entries NOW for the best contest ever held. Black and white prints must be a minimum of 20 x 25 cm mounted, and colour prints a minimum 12.5 x 17.5 cm mounted. Slides should preferably (but not necessarily) be mounted in glass.

NUCC TRIP TO TASMAHIA

At the beginning of this year a group of three from NUCC (ANU Canberra), Gordon Taylor, Tim Rudman and John Briggs came over here for an extensive caving trip during the summer vacation. Below is a brief summary of their trip from Gordon.

"Four main caving areas were visited: Junee-Florentine, Cracroft, Ida Bay and Mole Creek. The highlight of our time at the Junee-Florentine was the continued exploration of JF 341. The 200 ft. pitch was descended and a spacious and beautiful cave revealed itself. The exploration was left unfinished and a rough survey done. As well we did some surveying in The Chairman with Stuart Nicholas and descended Khazad-dum via Dwarrowdelf. The went to the Cracroft with TCC and so this will be covered elsewhere in the Spiel.

At Ida Bay we cut the track to mini Martin, and did the second only descent of Mini Martin using SRT. Another nearby cave, Big Tree Pot, was descended for 300 ft. to the top of a 200 ft. pitch, which almost certainly connects with Exit. Several entrances were also tagged on the hill. A couple of days were spent in Exit, and Entrance was also visited. Finally at Mole Creek we spent a considerable amount of time drinking 15 cent milkshakes but also found time to visit Lynds, Croesus, Scotts, Wet and Moneycomb Caves. The trip was admirably finished off by a trip through Kubla Mhan.
