



Sender says 'We were here and have seen the underground river & cave & they throw money in it & it cleaned out once a year and given to charities nearest Jenolan. They are fine caves but nothing as pretty as Naracoorte. These are more extensive and go for miles & in places 2JK80 feet high...'

The underground river today is often cloudy and carries a considerable silt load so that it would not serve as a 'wishing well'. On another card, ms. 17 Sept.1908, sender says 'We are having a good time stayed at Katoomba Wed. night. Thurs. morning caught paper train to Medlow. caught 9 o'c train (sic) to Jenolan. Glorious drive, marvellous sights, very cold clear weather. 5.00 Friday arrived at Medlow again after delightful drive. Will stay here tonight back to Katoomba tomorrow arrive Sydney early Monday.'


JK77B Special card –The Shambles, Stockton-on-Tees

A higher cavern in the Chifley Cave are commonly known as the Shambles. One can only assume that it was named after the contemporary British name for a meat market, used throughout much of the United Kingdom. This area of the cave is no longer open for general tours, but as it still has the original electrical fittings, it is sometimes used for historic tours.








Design of JK78C, together with package.






