

Wee Jasper (and region)

Wee Jasper is a small village south of Yass, and a number of caves are situated nearby, one of which has been open to the public at various periods in its history. This cave has been variously known as Wee Jasper Cave, Goodradigbee Cave and (at present) Carey's Cave. Narrengullen Cave and Cave Flat are nearby, and today are usually at least partly submerged beneath the Burrinjuck Dam.
